

 Pial bowled a total of 8.4 overs and conceded 40 runs for his seven-wicket haul.



# Chappell censures ICC



Former Australian captain lan Chappell wants cricket's rulers to display "muchneeded leadership" in tackling the crisis caused by Australia's World Cup boycott of Sri Lanka, report agencies.

In an article written a day before Australia formally announced its decision not to play in Colombo because of security fears, the out-spoken ex-Test star took a swipe at the International Cricket Council, the game's governing body. "This is a chance for

cricket's administrators to recover some of the credibility that has been lost in recent years through inept decision-making. Chappell wrote in the Indian Express I hope they take the op-


portunity to display some much-needed leadership and avoid cricket suffering yet another ignominy with a forfeited international match. he wrote.

Chappell said Australia's decision to stay away from Colombo could be shown in poor light a few years on, especially if terms such as Zimbabwe and Kenya agree to play in Sri Lanka and don't experience any trouble."

"The ICC has to come out and say that either all four

matches are to be played in Sri Lanka, or those games have been rescheduled and will be played elsewhere." Chappell wrote.

Chappell, who will be a television commentator at the World Cup, said the bomb blasts in Colombo last week which killed 80 people and injured 1,400, could not have come at a worst time.

"I don't think it is being too cynical to assume that the timing was perfectly planned by the terrorists to have maximum effect," he wrote.

"However, I would feel much better if'l knew that the Australian Cricket Board (ACB), alongwith the foreign affairs department, was exploring every contingency plan to ensure the Australian could full their playing obliga-

While, in Sydney, captain Mark Taylor said, Australia's World Cup players did not

pressure the Australian Cricket Board (ACB) into boycotting their opening series game in Colombo. Taylor was speaking soon

after the ACB announced in Melbourne that Australia would not be playing their World Cup match in Sri Lanka on February 17 and had asked the Cup's organising committee for another venue to stage it. Taylor said he had last

spoken with the ACB through its chief executive Graham Halbish last Thursday and there was no lobbying of the ACB by the players for each its decision Monday. "There was no pressure on the ACB from the players,"

Taylor said here at a press conference. "The board has made an unanimous decision which took things out of the players' hands.' In Colombo, Sri Lankan cricketers expressed disap-

pointment at the Australian

decision to keep away from the opening match in Colembo. "We don't want to earn points without playing the match." Sri Lanka's vice captain Aravinda de Silva told AFP. "We would very much

like the Australians to come.

But there is nothing we can do about it." Sri Lanka's manager Dulip Mendis said he was yet to be officially informed of the Aus-

tralia decision. He said his team would begin practices on Tuesday to prepare for the series.

PARIS, Feb 5: AC Milan and Atletico Madrid extended their respective leads
