### Fascination for banana cultivation

BARGUNA, Feb 6: Banana cultivation in the district is gradually becoming familiar and the production has been substantially increased recently, reports UNB.

Various species of banana grow in plenty in Betagi, Amtoli, Bamna. Patharghata and Sadar thanas of the district. The main varieties Sagor, Shabri and Kathali are being cultivated in the region.

According to growers, the crop is being cultivated on 10,000 acres of land in five thanas of the district and the acreage production is gradually increasing every year as its farming has appeared more profitable.

At present, a farmer earns Tk 23,000 to Tk 25,000 from one acre of land investing about Tk 15,000.

According to a statistics. there are 174 of government registered hats (weekly market) and bazars in the district. Of them, 51 big hats and bazars are being supervised by the Thana Nirbahi Officer (TNO) while the rest 123 hats and bazars are under union parishad's management.

Besides these registered hats and bazars, there are at least five hundred small unregistered hats and bazars functioning in the scattered and remote places catering the need of the both buyers and the sellers of commodities in the district. Conditions of these hats and bazars are also beyond descriptions. In the current Bengali

year, the government has earned a revenue worth about Taka one crore and twenty five lakh by leasing the registered hats and bazars through auction bid. While the registered hats and bazars are not paying any revenue to the government.

Twice or thrice in a week these hats function in the rural areas while in the thana and district headquarters. bazars function all the days long during the week.

Farmers and the traders with varieties of goods carrying on head-load, bi-cycles, carts and other means to come to these hats and bazars from the distant places and selling them. With this sort of the

transaction of goods among the sellers and buyers, the rural economy develops since the farmers finds at their doorsteps the convenient market places to dispose-off their produces to the consumers and the traders.

deplorable conditions due to non-spending of money either by the government or local bodies toward their developments.

There are no required sheds, sanitations, drainage, water supply and electricity facilities in these hats and bazars causing immense sufferings to both sellers and consumers, it is alleged.

During the rainy seasons, the sufferings of the consumers and the sellers become worst as the kutcha passage of these hats and bazars are entirely turned to muddy. On the otherhand, in absence of adequate number of sheds both the consumers and sellers find no shelters to escape from rain and other calamities.

Due to lack of public toilets, people are being compelled to go to nearby crop fields at natures call, creating pollutions to atmosphere around the hats and bazars, it is further alleged.

Inadequate number of tubewells and other means of water supply and lack of electricity facilities, the hats and bazars goers have been experiencing untold sufferings.

It is most surprising that, although the management of controlled by the revenue and the local government departments, but nobody is taking initiatives towards their improvement as yet.

When contacted the district level officials of the revenue and local government denied their responsibilities in this respect, saying that the Thana Nirbahi Officers (TNOs) and the union parishad chairmen are entrusted to execute all sorts of developmental works of the hats and bazars.

They further pointed out that, 15 per cent amount out of the revenue collected by leasing the hats and bazars permissible to spend for its developments as per standing circular of the local government ministry.

But there are allegations that almost entire fund meant for developments of the hats and bazars which are realised annually from the lease amount, totally being misappropriated by the authority concerned.

Apart from these, the road communications around most of the rural hats are in deplorable state, as a result, the plying of the transports have been facing a great hindrance to and from these hats. it is alleged by the local people.

### Viral disease kata breaks out in Jhenidah

From Our Correspondent JHENIDAH, Feb 6: At least

2,500 goats died and another 5,000 were affected by a viral disease Kata in Mohespur and Kotchandpur thanas of the district during last two months, it was re-

According to reports, the deadly disease Kata was detected in Mohespur thana and Kotchandpur thanas of the district and some bordering areas of Jibannagar, Darshana and Alamdanga thanas of Chuadanga district in 1993 first. At that time, sources said, at least 10,000 goats dled and over 46,000 were affected by the disease. The disease was then brought under control by the Livestock Department after proper measures. The disease was further detected in October last year in border areas of

Mohespur and Kotchandpur thanas and the situation was brought under control further in November of same year, it was learnt.

In January this year the disease Kata affected the area and took serious turn

When contacted, Mohespur and Kotchandpur thana livestock office sources said that everyday a good number of goats have been dying and the farmers have been bringing their goats to local offices daily for treatment. Some peasants of Moheshpur and Kotchandpur thanas told that the Livestock Department has failed to treat goats this year. They said that the affected goats die within two to three days after attack by
