Witnesses said the accident took place when a front wheel of the running bus became loose and the driver lost control of the vehicle.

Driver Abul Kashem, 35, and his assistant aged 28 died on the spot. The injured persons were admitted to Shingra and Sadar hospitals.

A survey found that 65 per. cent of the respondents feared that the February 15 elections will lead to political unrest and instability, while 18 per cent saw the next parliament as a transitional one which would facilitate a fully participatory election.

The findings of the Power and Participation Research Centre (PPRC) opinion poli also revealed that 13 per cent of the respondents considered peace would be established after the elections, while two per cent demanded for new leader-

The PPRC survey, conducted on 'Crisis Transition and Anarchy' in January, was released yesterday in a press conference held at the Jatiya Press Club. A total of 1075 voting-aged adults from Dhaka City participated in the opinion poll. Hossain Zillur Rahman.


