Italian parliament dissolved

ROME, Feb 16: Italian President Oscar Luigi Scalfaro today dissolved parliament, paving the way to early elections. The decision follows more than a month of political crisis caused by the resignation of caretaker Prime Minister Lamberto Dini and the failure since then of Italian political leaders to agree on a new government and on political reforms to end chronic political instability, reports AFP.

The CEC also said that he was going to propose new electoral laws in future. "We have a Pre-poll Irregularities Committee but we do not have one which deals with the post-poll irregularity, this should be amended," Justice Sadeq said.

The District Administration has no information regarding these officers, the Control Room sources added. Meanwhile, the Control

Room said that the elections were held in only 43 centres in the district while elections could not be held in the rest 445 centres due to violence and absence of polling officials.

The turnout of voters was very poor, said the control room sources. In each of the 40 centres, an average of 15 votes were cast while in each of the remaining three centres, the turnout was around 1000, the sources added. UNB adds: A clash be-

Announcing the pro-gramme at a rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club, Hasina renewed her call to the President to intervene and form a caretaker government for holding elections within 90

The AL president brought charges against the ruling party of large-scale rigging in the elections held on Thurs-

She said the people have totally rejected the "mockery of elections staged by the BNP and urged the Chief Election Commissioner to stop ennouncement of the polf results. Criticising the role of the

Election Commission, Hasina said the people would take account of their stolen votes She said the people by re-

fraining from casting votes in the just held elections expressed their no-confidence in the BNP government which has now lost its legitimacy.

Those who have been declared elected would be branded as 'enemies of the people' and they would face resistance wherever they go. she said. The AL chief accused the

overnment of killing at least 20 people during Thursday's 'farcical' election. "There was no election on
