Indo-Nepal power accord

BOMBAY, Feb 17: India and Nepal signed a power agreement here today which would allow the land-locked Himalayan kingdom to provide more electricity to its giant-neighbour, officials said, reports

The agreement was signed by Indian Power Secretary P Abraham and Nepalese Water Resources Secretary Pashupatinath Dhungel at a luncheon meeting organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry. they said.

Abraham said the "umbrella agreement" would facilitate the purchase of power from Nepal. "India can also sell power to Nepal under the agreement,"

he said. The agreement would also open up Nepal to private indian investors, who could set up power generation facilities and sell the energy to India.

He said Nepal's hydro-electric potential was about 80,000 megawatts and its total installed capacity only a fraction. of that.


