Business under Bus Shed

Living in a place like Dhaka, one comes to see many different sights - some weird, some wonderful, some funny, and some of which are just plain ugly. In fact, being a Dhakaite, one gets so used to these things that one hardly gives them a second glance. But looking at Dhaka through a foreigner's eyes (preferably one from a Western country) would be like looking at the scenes of 'Ripley's. Believe it or not 'such are the weird and crazy things that go on happening here. If one starts the list. needless to say it would take up the entire space in the column and much more.

Some of these interesting sights that have been seen in different parts of the city are the BRTC bus 'sheds' or stops which are being taken over by a group of people for their own purposes. These sheds were constructed at bus stops of every important road of the city. Though their original purpose was for the people to wait under them for the buses, it seems that this is the last thing they are used for. Even though buses are supposed to arrive and pick up passengers from these stops, funnily they never seem to do so. Nowadays, the only places they seem to pick up and drop

passengers, are right in the middle of the streets. And these bus sheds have been taken over by shop-keepers of almost all varieties. From flower shops to pharmacy, from newspa-per to fast food are all housed in the little space under the sheds. Under almost every bus shed one can see a "mini-shop" doing brisk business. In some of these, a small corner was originally meant for opening a shop but later on the entire space has been taken over, leaving hardly any place for the passengers to wait for a bus, or protect them against rain and scorching heat - both of which are abundant

And these people who have started their businesses here must be paying some sort of a rent to someone. Who are they paying this rent to? Most of them when asked are not willing to talk about it. So it makes one wonder if there is anything shady going on. Is there any place left for the passengers after all? Have we all forgotten the original purpose of building these things? Jumping up and down from a bus into the streets is extremely dangerous but like most other things in Dhaka, no one seems to care or do anything about it.

KHULNA, Feb 17: A nongovernment organisation (NGO) today granted Tk 1.54 crore for rehabilitation of the people affected by Friday's devastating fire in a city slum, reports UNB.

The NGO, Christian Service Society (CSS), announced the grant at a high-level meeting here on Saturday. The grant includes Tk 24

lakh for reconstruction of the slum and Tk 1.30 crore for self-employment of the slumdwellers.

The meeting was attended by Speaker Shaikh Razzak Ali, Khuina City Corporation Mayor Shaikh Tayebur Rahman, Divisional Commissioner Nazmul Alam Siddiqui, Deputy Commissioner Mujibur Rahman and CSS representatives.

Some 2,500 huts were gutted in the fire rendering 14,000 people homeless. The extent of damage was estimated at Tk five crore.

The affected people have been given shelter in four schools in the city.

Zoha's death anniversary today



... Dr Zoha the then proctor and an associate professor of Chemistry Department of the university was killed by the Pakistani Army on February 18, 1969 on the campus.

Dr Zoha received bullet injury while he was trying to protect the agitating students who were protesting against the Ayub regime.
