Minor girl killed as bomb goes off in Ctg

CHITTAGONG, Mar 21: A minor girl was killed while another was seriously injured when an abandoned bomb exploded at Lalkhan Bazar today, police and hospital sources said.

Shimul Aktar, 7, succumbed to her injuries at the Chittagong Medical College Hospital while Shamsun Nahar, 5, was under treatment there. Both of them were injured in the explosion this morning while collecting waste papers at Lalkhan Bazar area, police said.

The 13th day of non-cooperation programme called by the Opposition passed off peacefully barring some stray incidents.

Police dispersed the supporters of Opposition parties and ruling party when they tried to hold rallies at the same venue at Fakirhat near port jetty no. 3 this afternoon.

Using a megaphone, police asked the activists of both the sides not to hold any rally near the port.

Meanwhile, the opposition activists last night ransacked a rail station at Baraiardala, sources said.

The army personnel deployed in the port city were on duty at all strategic points for the second consecutive day today.

Some autorickshaws and tempos were seen plying in the city and its surrounding areas from morning. Shops and markets reopened in large numbers following exemption from non-cooperation during 2 pm to 10 pm today.

Life was seemingly normal after 2 pm as movement of people in the city marked an increase.

Railway sources said train service to and from Chittagong was normal today.

Some goods train also left Chittagong port early morning for Narayanganj and Mymensingh, port sources added.

However, cargo handling and delivery of goods from the stuck-up cargo vessels at the port could not be resumed today despite repeated efforts by the government, port sources said.

At least 53 cargo ships remained stranded at Chittagong port jetties and outer anchorage due to the ongoing deadlock.

Energy Minister Oli Ahmed arrived in Chittagong today and held a meeting with port officials and port users representatives.

The meeting held this afternoon at the port rest house, asked the stevedores to start gang-booking of labourers immediately for restoration of cargo handling activities, port sources said.

Earlier, the port officials attended a meeting in the morning with the naval chief, port sources said. The navy personnel, deployed inside the port area, remained on duty for security reasons.

Port officials informed that partial cargo handling had resumed from 4 pm today as some dock workers were engaged by a stevedor for unloading of foodgrain from a ship anchored at jetty no. 2.

Some 20 trucks were also placed inside the port for taking delivery of foodgrain and bitumen, port officials said.

They hoped that operational activities at Chittagong port would resume fully from tomorrow if all port users come forward.

Purulia arms-dropping 13 chargesheeted

CALCUTTA, Mar 21: The CBI yesterday filed chargesheets against the 13 main accused in the December 17 Purulia arms dropping case, before the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Calcutta, AK Dasgupta, reports PTI.

Of the accused six were now in jail custody and the rest were absconding. Although no direct reference was made to the Ananda Marg in the chargesheets, some of the accused were members of the organisation, according to SP (CBI), Loknath Behera.

The accused were charged with waging war against the state and other charges under Sections 121, 121, 122, 122A and 123 of the IPC and for giving false information to various public servants.

Besides, 19 others not named in the chargesheet were under investigation in the case.

Apart from the six crew members of the aircraft the other seven chargesheeted persons were Kim Peter Davey, Dayanand alias Deepak, Randy, Saileshvarananda Avadhoot alias Umesh Sharma, Jagdishvarananda Avadhoot, Dhavanda Avadhoot and Bhanu Ramesh.

Peter Davey, who was mentioned in the chargesheet with two aliases, was in the AN-26 aircraft at the time of arms dropping, but mysteriously disappeared after it landed at the Bombay Airport.

Ten of the accused have been also charged for violation of the Arms Act and Explosive Substances Act, while six of the crew members of the aircraft and Peter Davey and Dayananda have been accused of violation of different sections of Aircraft Act, cheating (section 420) and providing false information (Section 177).

Behera said out of the absconding accused in the case, Saileshvarananda was the in-charge of Ananda Marg's Munger Centre, while Jagdishvarananda belonged to the Purulia headquarters.

Bhanu Ramesh, who was originally from Kerala and was settled in Delhi, was the main financier of the whole operation of the arms dropping, according to the chargesheet.

The dacoits decamped with gold ornaments of about 60 tola, Tk 20,000, and valuable work about Tk five lakh, police said.

In a separate incidents, another gang of dacoits at the gunpoint looted 11 tolas of gold ornaments, a television set and cash worth more than Tk one lakh from a house at Zigatola staff quarters early yesterday, said a member of the family.

As a crowd of passers-by watched, the 19-year-old, identified only by his surname Wu, suddenly lost his colour and collapsed after finishing a fifth pack of Peony brand cigarettes. Tianjin city's Jinwan Bao said in an edition seen today in Beijing.

Wu, a construction worker, was declared dead soon after being rushed to Tianjin's air force maritime village hospital, it said.

Foreign buyers cancel order for Tk 200cr shrimp

From Our Correspondent KHULNA, Mar 21: Foreign buyers have cancelled export orders of frozen shrimp worth over Tk 200 crore, according to sources concerned.

At present, exportable shrimp worth over Tk 400 crore is rotting at the freezing plants in Khulna zone, the sources said.

Khulna zone largely contributes to the country's foreign exchange earning from export of shrimp. During fiscal 1994-95, foreign exchange equivalent to over Tk 550 crore was earned by exporting shrimp through Mongia port.

According to Shrimp Exporters' Association (SEA), foreign buyers have cancelled letters of credit due to continuing delay in shipment of exportable shrimp because of political crisis.

NATO swoops on 'Mujahideen' camp in Bosnia

SARAJEVO, Mar 21: NATO swooped on a suspected 'Mujahideen' camp in southern Bosnia, mounting a similar operation to one last month that netted several Iranians, an alliance source told AFP today.

Garments units may get compensation

The government is planning to provide compensation to the garment industries, hit the hardest by the Opposition's non-cooperation programme, Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman said in Dhaka yesterday, reports UNB.

He told a high-level meeting that losses to the ready-made garment sector being inflicted by the opposition programme will be studied and compensated on case by case basis in the light of the overall resource constraints of the government.

Rahman chaired the meeting held at his office to review the situation in the financial, trade, fiscal and industrial sectors in view of the on-going political agitation.

The meeting was attended by Banking Division Secretary Dr ATM Shamsul Huda, a Deputy Governor of Bangladesh Bank, Managing Directors and senior officials of Nationalised Commercial Banks (NCBs).

The Finance Minister expressed deep concern at the losses caused to the financial, trade and industrial sectors due to the continuous non-cooperation movement, according to an official handout.

He said it is unfortunate that all the agitations of the opposition parties are directed against the economy. "It's not a responsible and healthy political practice," he said.

Rahman was particularly anxious about the plight of the garments industries which have been hit the hardest by the present political movement.

"Such irresponsible acts are benefiting only our neighbours," he said.
