At least five people were killed and more than 200 injured in a violent storm that lashed 12 villages in Gouripur thana on Tuesday noon, according to UNB.

Some 500 kutcha houses were destroyed and innumerable trees uprooted by the nor wester that struck at about 1:30 pm.

The storm swept Namapara Kaorat, Mesidengi, Surjokona Shologai. Ramchandranagar Mukhuria, Palohati, Dekura Khaledbari, Naynagar and Bishanpur villages

The dead were identified as Siddique, 30, of Surjokona, Asia 40 of Paluhati, Abdul Barek 45, and an unidentified child of Ramchandranagar and Jarina, 40, of Kaurati village.

Of the injured, 26 were sent to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital, 15 to Gouripur Hospital and several others to Netrakona Hospital in critical condition.


