Despite his landslide election victory last weekend. Lee has bowed to opposition objections to other possible candidates. His Nationalist Party has only a two-seat majority in the 164-seat legislature, which must approve his choice.

Lee plans to name Lee Yuantseh, a non-politician who shared the 1986 Nobel for chemistry and whom the opposition says it will accept, the United Evening News reported. The two Lees are not related
