The sixth Parliament was elected in the February 15 polls, boycotted by the major opposition parties for not being held under a neutral caretaker government they had long been demanding.

Later, on March 9, the Awami League, Jatiya Party

and Jamaat-e-Islami launched a non-stop non-cooperation movement for cancellation of the February 15 polls, resignation of the BNP government and fresh polls under a neutral caretaker government.

Earlier on the day, Begum Zia in a letter, requested President Biswas to dissolve Parliament.

The letter was delivered by Minister for Energy and Mineral Resources Oli Ahmed and Finance Minister M Saifur Rahman.

The end of Begum Zia's administration, which took office on March 19 for the second term came very swiftly having been in office for only 12 days.

Ever since the elections on February 15, the BNP came under severe criticism from the major political parties accusing it of rigging the polls. The Opposition said it (BNP) wanted to continue in

Truce in CHT extended till Apr 30

From Staff Correspondent CHITTAGONG, Mar 30: Shantibahini leaders have agreed to extend the ceasefire in the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) till April 30 to maintain peace and tranquility there during the period of political transition in the country, official sources said here today.

The ongoing truce in the CHT is due to expire tomorrow (March 31).

The decision to extend the truce was conveyed to Convenor of the Liaison Committee Hangshadoz Chakma in a letter from the Shantibahini leaders today. Hangshadoz Chakma in a letter to the Shantibahini leaders on Thursday had requested for extension of the truce.

The ceasefire was unil ally declared by the Sitibahini on August 1, 1992 to pave the way for holding talks with the elected government. The first round of peace-talks was hold on November 5.

Both the sides held seven rounds of talks.
