The capital yesterday turned into a city of jubilation and mancha (podiums) following the dissolution of parliament and the announcement of formation of the caretaker government.

Thousands of people thronged the streets as the country's prolonged political crisis apparently ended. Songs, slogans, speeches and chats ruled the air.

The scene was more of a fanfare rather than any political programme as men and women of all ages enjoyed songs, cultural programmes, had a plate of chatpati and gossiped.

Two mammoth rallies - one of BNP and another of the opposition - took place within a distance of only half a kilometre from where leaders delivered their fiery speeches.

An official source said about Tk 29 crore were allotted for implementation of these projects.

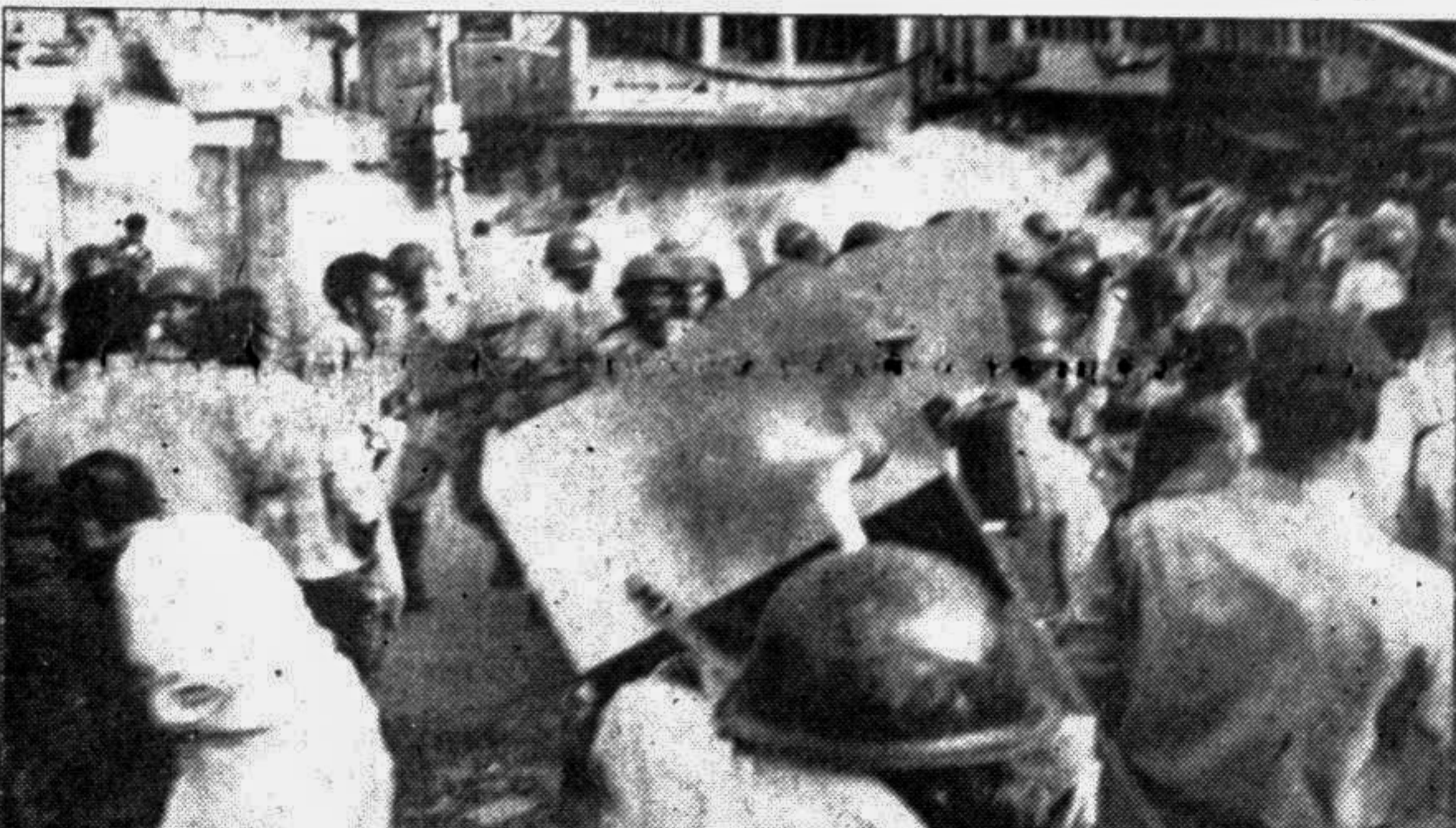
'Victory procession' in Sylhet

SYLHET, Mar 30: The three opposition parties brought out separate Victory processions here following the declaration of swearing in of ex-Chief Justice Habibur Rahman as Chief Advisor of the Caretaker Government.

Thousands of activists and leaders of Awami League, Jatiya Party and Jamaat joined their respective processions which paraded the city streets.

Two US senators for an orderly transfer of power

Two members of the US Senate in a letter to their country's Secretary of State on Friday stressed the need for transfer of power in Bangladesh in an orderly democratic process and the protection of former (government) leaders.

"If Bangladesh is ever going to resolve the issue of power transfer through an orderly democratic process, protection of former leaders must be guaranteed. If giving up power means giving up one's livelihood or one's freedom, leaders are not going to give up power easily. Moreover, political leaders must be ensured that if they relinquish power they will have an opportunity to return to power legitimately," the letter mentioned.

The US Senators - Claiborne Pell and Richard G. Lugar - further observed that now was the time for Bangladesh to take important steps in the direction towards democracy and urged the State Department Secretary, Warren Christopher, to support the people of Bangladesh in resolving the issue of power transfer through orderly democratic means.

In their view, the greatest source of difficulty in Bangladesh is absence of democratic system of transferring power. In this regard, they pointed out that when former President Ershad agreed in

Life in Ctg normal

CHITTAGONG, Mar 30: People of all walks of life here had a sigh of relief when calm returned to the city as soon as they received the news of nomination of a chief advisor for a non-party caretaker government by President Abdur Rahman Biswas this afternoon, reports BSS.

Panic, tension and fear which gripped the people during the three-week non-cooperation movement of the main-stream political parties seem to have ended with the hope that political agitation is no more needed.

Life came to a standstill during the past over two weeks as Chittagong Port remained inoperative, mills and factories remained closed, motorised vehicles were off the road, shutters of shops

downed, sources of income for daily wage earners were absent and banks suspended transactions. The people had great sufferings when there was scarcity of essential commodities as well as their high prices.

Thousands of people were stranded here and there while many could not keep touch with the members of their families at remote villages for lack of transport. Even there were cases of some people who could not attend the funeral of their dead relatives or see their ailing dear and near ones.

Bejia Mea, an employee of a contractor could not attend the funeral of his dead father in a remote village of Chakaria under Cox's Bazar district as transport was not available on March 12. Similar stories were heard from several other persons who could not reach home during non-cooperation movement.

Giving their reaction on the news of formation of non-party caretaker government and dissolution of the sixth parliament, a number of citizens said, 'we are happy that there would probably be no political agitation as the main demands of the opposition political parties have been fulfilled. We would also be happy when there are no bomb explosion and gun shots in the city.'

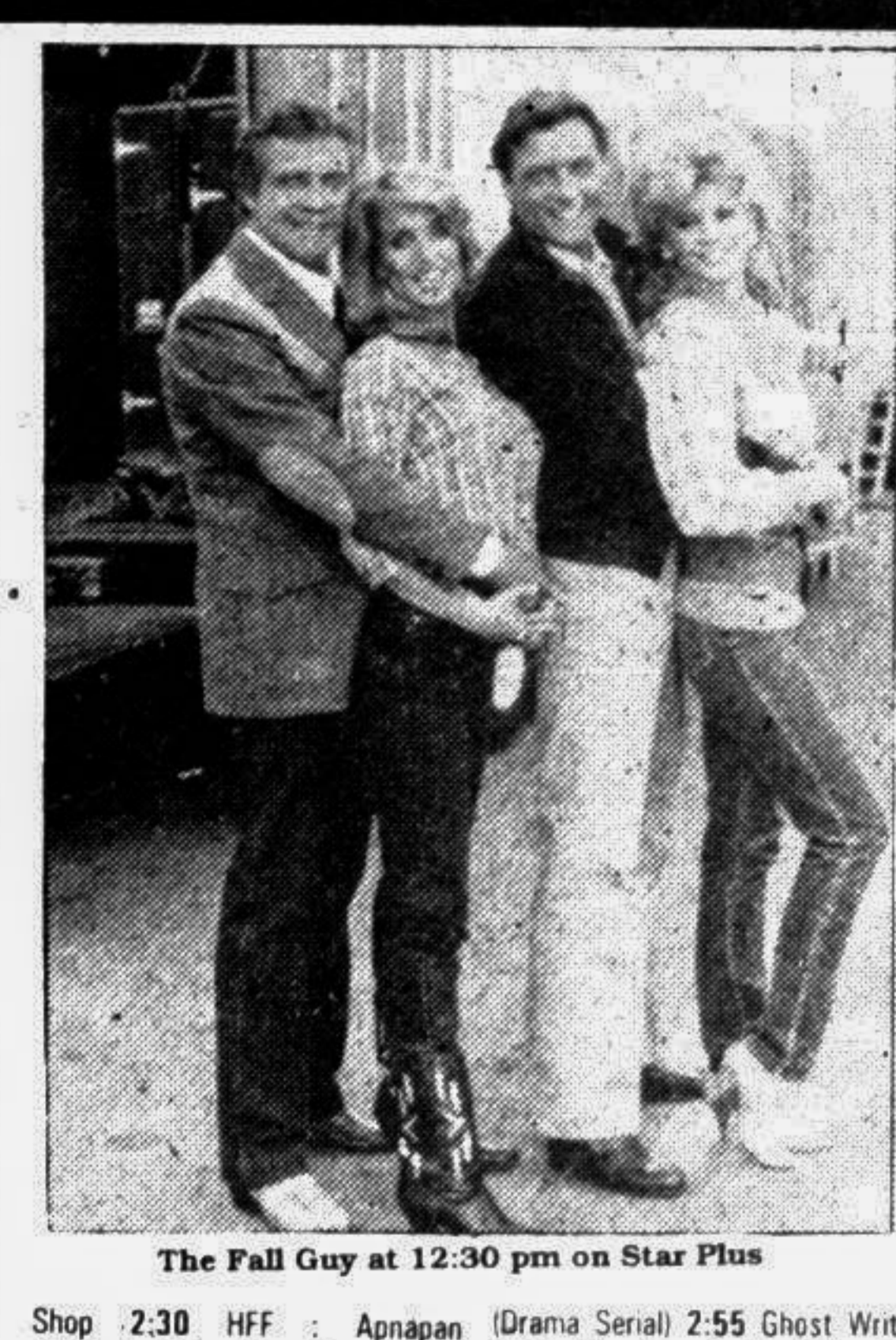

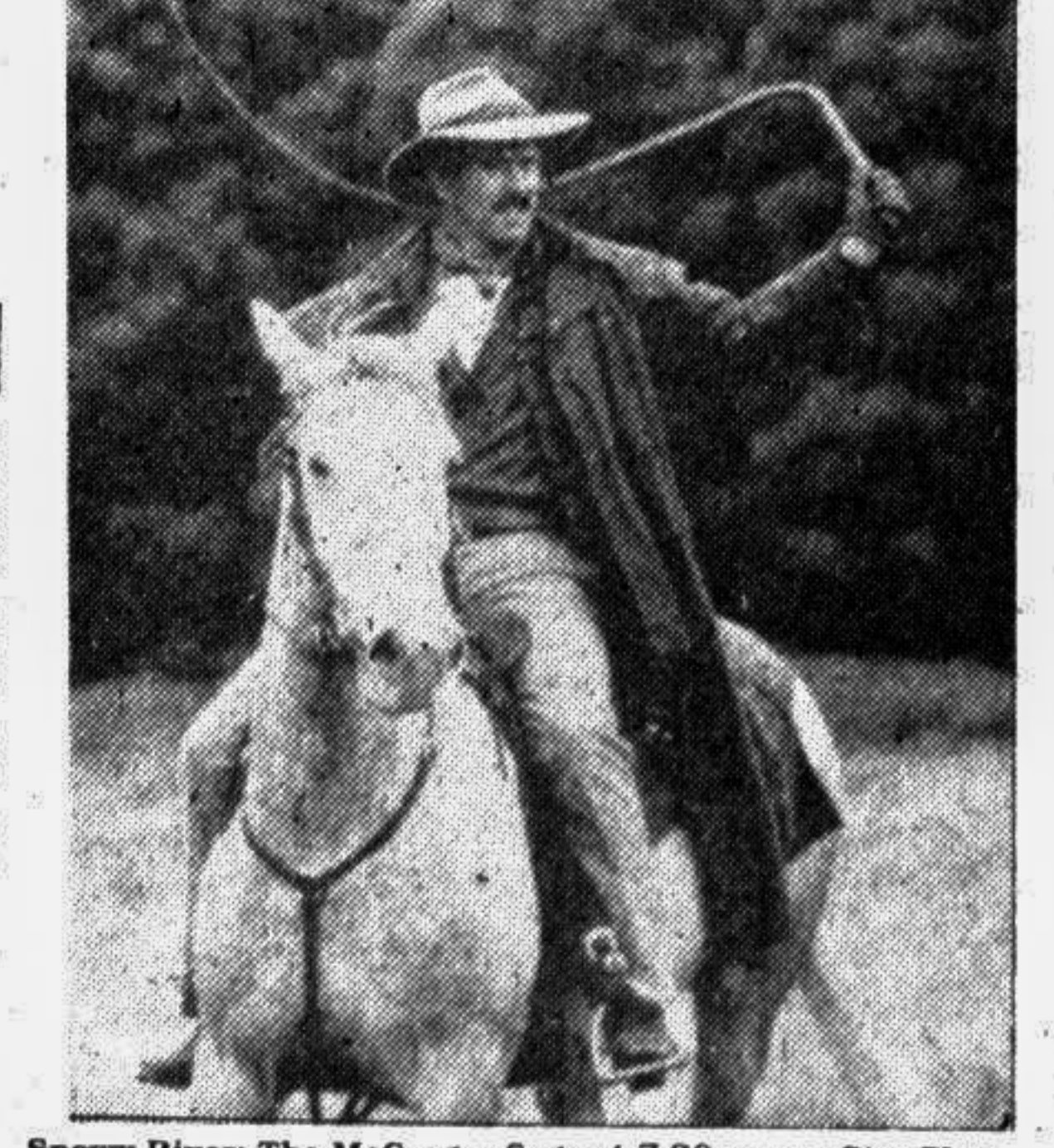
