Capital turns into a city of joy

The capital vesterday turned into a city of jubilation and manchas (podiums) following the dissolution of parliament and the announcement of formation of the caretaker government

Thousands of people thronged the streets as the country's prolonged political crisis apparently ended. Songs slogans, speeches and chats ruled the air. The scene was more of a

fanfare rather than any political programme as men and women of all ages enjoyed songs, cultural programmes, had a plate of chatpatt and gossiped.

It was an almost peaceful co-existence of political activists and members of different groups and thoughts. Two mammoth rallies -

one of BNP and another of the opposition — took place within a distance of only half a kilometre from where leaders de-

livered their fiery speeches. In front of Jativa Press Club. the Janatar Mancha (people's podium) was crammed with jubilant people, claiming victory of the opposition.

At city's Purana Paltan area in front of the Jonaki Cinema Ganotantra Mancha (democr acy podium) of BNP was erected from where BNP chief Begum Khaleda Zia addressed a huge rally.

Jamaat erected its Caretaker Mancha at the north gate of Baitul Mukarram mosque: Jatiya Mancha of Jatiya Party was set up at Bangabandhu Avenue, leftist political leaders set up another mancha at Nur Hossain Square near Gulistan, Peshajibi Mancha (professionals' podium) was staged by JSD (Rab) at Dainik Bangla crossing, and Islami Mancha was set up by Islami Sashantantra at Stadium



Two US senators for an orderly transfer of power

Two members of the US Senate in a letter to their country's Secretary of State on Friday stressed the need for transfer of power in Bangladesh in an orderly democratic process and the protection of former (government) leaders. reports PROBE news agency.

"If Bangladesh is ever going to resolve the issue of power transfer through an orderly democratic process, protec-tion of former leaders must be guaranteed. If giving up power means giving up one's liveli-hood or one's freedom, leaders are not going to give up power easily. Moreover, political leaders must be ensured that if they relinquish power they will have an opportunity to return to power legitimately," the let-

The US Senators -Claiborne Pell and Richard G Lugar — further observed that now was the time for Bangladesh to take important steps in the direction towards democracy and urged the State Department Secretary, Warren Christopher, to support the people of Bangladesh in resolving the issue of power transfer through orderly democratic

ter mentioned.

In thefr view, the greatest source of difficulty in Bangladesh is absence of democratic system of transferring power. In this regard, they pointed out, that when former President Ershad agreed in the face of growing unrest to hand over power to a caretaker government to hold elections, they hoped that step was being taken towards solving the problem of transferring authority. But, they added.

those hopes were dashed. In order to ensure a free and fair democratic process, the US Senators believed that Begum Khaleda Zia and other BNP leaders and the opposition parties, including the Awami League and the Jatiya Party must have confidence that free and fair polls would be held. "All parties must be able to participate on equal terms. Moreover, whether a party wins and loses, it must have confidence that the losers will not be punished, and that the freedom or livelihood of individual members will not be threatened because of their participation in the elections."

The letter also said that former President Ershad should be released and viewed. his continued imprisonment clearly seemed to be the result of political considerations rather than the administration of justice.

It also stressed that elections (in Bangladesh) must be held under recognised international standards with democratic and international observers. "Only then can Bangladesh and the larger international community have confidence in the results."

We would also be happy when there are no bomb explosion and gun shots in the city.
