Quake shakes India, Pakistan

NEW DELHI, Apr 1: India's capital New Delhi was struck by a moderate earthquake today, but there were no reports of injuries or damage, officials

A spokesman for the Indian meteorological department told Reuters that the quake measured 5.5 on the Richter scale and was recorded at 1:39 pm (0809 gmt).

He said the government agency had not yet determined the epicentre of the quake.

Another report says, a moderate earthquake jolted parts of central and northern Pakistan today, but there was no immediate report of any damage, officials said.

A seismological centre in the northwestern town of Peshawar said the 1.08 pm (0808 gmt) quake was measured 5.3 on the Richter scale. powerful enough to cause heavy damage in a populated area, and was centred 300 km (190 miles) southeast of there in the central province of

The tremor, coming only a week after one measuring 4.6 on Richter scale shook northern Pakistan, was also felt in Islamabad and the Punjab cities of Lahore and Faisalabad, centre officials said.

From Page 1 Before he rolls up his sleeves, he will have to undergo a day of medical tests.

Walesa left the shipyards in April 1989 to lead the Solidarity Trade Union in the fight which toppled communism and propelled him to power as President.

"I am not going back to the shipyards on April 1 as people might think it is a joke," said Walesa, who was ousted at the polls in November by former communist Aleksander Kwasniewski.

The move is aimed at publicising his financial plight as well as restoring his proletarian image which has taken a drubbing in recent years.

Under Polish law, former presidents do not get a pension, although Walesa does have an official car and security services at his disposal. A bill has just been submitted to parliament on pensions for former president.

"The political system does not determine what a former president should do, what he should live on. I am too young to get retirement benefits, said the 52-year-old Walesa.

In addition, Polish tax authorities are demanding more than 400,000 dollars in taxes on a million dollars which a US film company paid him in 1989. He has just mortgaged his home in Gdansk to try and meet that bill

The irony of the situation is not lost on Walesa, who will be earning half the salary of his bodyguard. "It will be a bit strange, as I will go to the shipyards in a Mercedes, and for eight hours a bodyguard will watch me work."
