



SAARC secy-gen arrives in city Apr 12

KATHMANDU, Apr 8: The Secretary-General of the seven-nation South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) Naeem U Hasan will pay a four-day official visit to Dhaka from April 12, a high official of the SAARC Secretariat told the South Asian News Agency here today.

This will be Naeem's first visit to Bangladesh after his assumption of office as the SAARC Secretary-General on January 1 last.

Talking to SANA, the official said Naeem, during his visit, will discuss with Chief Adviser Justice Habibur Rahman different collaborative programmes of the regional grouping and future course of action that the SAARC has undertaken for poverty alleviation of an estimated one billion people.

Naeem U Hasan will also, during his call on the head of the Bangladesh caretaker government, brief him on the ongoing projects of the SAARC.

Naeem has already acclaimed Bangladesh's unique contribution to the birth and the cause of the SAARC.
