

**Japan extends Youth Friendship Programme**

The government of Japan has extended the "Japan-Bangladesh Youth Invitational Friendship Programme" for a period of another five years beginning this year, reports BSS.

Morimasa Kanamaru, resident representative of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and Bhasan Shamim, Deputy Secretary, ERD signed a note on behalf of their respective governments Wednesday in this regard.

**'44 HIV cases detected in Bangladesh'**

There is now 4.5 million AIDS patients all over the world and 50 per cent of them is women.

This was stated by the president of a newly-formed NGO at a press conference at the Jatiya Press Club yesterday.

Dr Halida Hanum, who heads Confidential Approach to AIDS Prevention (CAP), said at present the number of HIV positive cases in the world, which cause AIDS, is 20 million.

She told a questioner that 2 million people in India is infected with AIDS virus and 50 per cent of the prostitutes in Bombay is carrying HIV positive.

Referring to a recent survey, Hanum said that only 44 HIV cases including three women had been detected in Bangladesh.
