Malaysian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Dato Mahayuddin Bin Abd Rahman called on President Abdur Rahman Biswas at Bangabhaban yesterday, reports BSS.

He stayed with the President for some time and handed over to him a personal letter from Prime Minister Dr Mahathir Mohammad.


They hoped that the existing friendly relationship of their respective country with Bangladesh would strengthen further on the basis of cordiality and cooperation in coming days.

Discussion on int'l treaties

Participants at a round-table discussion on "taking international conventions to the people," yesterday called for regular steps for translating such treaties for people's benefit, reports BSS.

Chaired by the Social Welfare Secretary Shah Abdul Hannan, the discussion was initiated by the Secretary General of Bangladesh Environmental Lawyers Association (BELA), Dr. Mohiuddin Faroque.

It was participated by Paul Bailey of the ILO, Shahjahan Miah of the BFUW, Dr. Craig Anderson of the USAID, Dr. Mahfuzul Haque of the Ministry of Environment and Forest, M. Anwarul Islam of the IUCN, Dr. Mizanur Rahman and Dr. Abrar Chowdhury of the Dhaka University, Dr. Atique Rahman of the BCAS, Ms Khushi Kabir of the CEN, M. Ruhul Amin of the MOFA and Dr Sattar.

Dwelling on the importance of taking the international treaties to the people for their effective realisation, the participants pleaded for laying all such treaties before parliament as per constitutional provision.

They stressed the need for more homework and team work among the ministries as well as the member of civil society before entering into international conventions and their implementation from national benefit.

'Many development projects not well-planned'

A senior government official yesterday admitted that a large number of development projects in the country are conceived whimsically without assessing their cost benefit, reports UNB.

Inaugurating a training course on "Project Management" in the city yesterday afternoon, Food Secretary A Muyeed Chowdhury also cautioned against donor funded projects which, he observed, often caused unnecessary delays in incurring higher costs.

Muyeed Chowdhury, who is due to take over as chief executive of the Jamuna Multipurpose Bridge Authority today suggested the participants to be maximum cautious in choosing right projects for their successful completion.

A wrongly chosen project is bound to fail, he observed.

Donation for ailing Ilyas

DU student beaten up

A student of Dhaka University was severely beaten up by some unidentified miscreants in front of the Central Library of the university at around 3:15 pm yesterday.

Witnesses said that a member of the gang asked the student to lend his motor-bike for some time but he refused. At this they got angry and beat him up with rod and sticks.

The attackers then took the motor cycle to Zia Hall of the university.

Police raided the hall around 4 pm yesterday but could not recover anything.

Cornea transplanted

A cornea collected posthumously from a donor, had been transplanted successfully to an eye of a young man at the National Institute of Ophthalmology yesterday, reports UNB.

Sandhani Jatiya Chokkhdan Samity (SJCS) collected the cornea from Sheikh Mahmud Karim Nanna (27), a typist of the Chief Accountant of Food Ministry, died of kidney ailments at PG hospital on Friday.

Nanna, hailed from the village Padmanagar of Kachua thana in Bagerhat district, donated his eye on 11th February, 1992 to SJCS and Sandhani International Eye Bank, Bangladesh.

Professor M A Hadi, an ophthalmologist, grafted the cornea to the left eye of Hosain Al Mamun, a degree examinee from Mirpur Bangla College.

SJCS received promises from more than 25,000 people for posthumous donation of their eyes so far. It collected a total of 801 corneas in its bank.


