

## 7 Indian troops killed in Kashmir gunfight

SRINAGAR, Apr 20: Seven Indian soldiers and two politicians were killed in Kashmir today in a sudden outbreak of violence ahead of India's general elections, police and officials said, reports AFP.

The soldiers were killed in a fierce gun battle with Muslim militants near the town of Kupwara near the Pakistani frontier, a police spokesman said here, adding the fighting was still raging.

An army officer said the troops had killed six militants in the firefight.

"The gun battle began in the morning and is still continuing". Brigadier P P S Bindra said here "we have killed at least six militants, many of these militants had infiltrated from Pakistan to disrupt the polls."

The incident was one of the worst flare-ups yet in Kashmir, India's only Muslim-majority state which will go to the polls next month to pick six MPs to federal parliament in New Delhi. Indian general elections are due in April-May.

Earlier, unidentified gunmen killed two Muslim members of the pro-India national conference party in Kupwara town, police said in this summer capital of Kashmir state.

The victims were identified as Mohammed Sultan Tantray

and Ghulam Rasool Magray. It was not clear why the two were killed as the national conference has decided to boycott the ballot.

On Friday, an unspecified number of gunmen stormed the house of Wali Mohammed Wani, a candidate of the Awami Tehrik Party, at Baramula town, nearly 65 kilometers (40 miles) north of here, and shot dead his brother.

They asked for him and not finding him there opened indiscriminate fire killing his brother," the police spokesman said.

The Awami Tehrik is a new political party founded by former Muslim militants and is contesting all the three parliamentary seats in the Kashmir valley.

The AL president said it was regrettable that the nation was celebrating the silver jubilee of its independence with 86 per cent of the population living under the poverty-line.

Hasina urged her partymen to work unitedly for candidates to be nominated by the parliamentary board of the party and said, "if we can form the next government, there will be enough scope for your leadership through the elections of local government bodies."

She told the delegates that Awami League's political rivals were indulging in propaganda against the party and quoted from a leaflet that gave an estimate of her wealth. She smiled and said "According to this leaflet, I own four houses abroad and I am the richest person in Bangladesh," she added. "Well, prove it and if really I own four houses outside the country I will be glad enough to donate those to Bangladeshi living abroad."

## 9 killed, 40 injured in road accidents

At least nine people were killed and 40 others hurt in five road accidents in the city, Chandpur and Barisal yesterday and Friday.

Our DMCH Correspondent says: At least five people were killed in four road accidents in the city yesterday and the day before.

Two bi-cycle riders were fatally wounded when a minibus hit their bike in front of the Joy Kali Mandir, Sutrapur around 7:45 am. The victims, who could not be identified, were rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH), where they died immediately after the admission, according to sources.

Police impounded the minibus but the driver managed to escape, police added.

Another person was killed when a speeding truck knocked him down on Mazar Road under Mirpur thana at 8:20 am, police sources said.

The body of the unidentified man was sent to the DMCH and a case was filed with the Mirpur thana.

An unidentified male, aged about 30, was seriously wounded when a minibus ran him over in front of the Bangabhaban at 8 am yesterday.

He was admitted to the DMCH, where he succumbed to his injuries in the afternoon.

In another accident, one Mohammad Shahjahan, 35, was critically injured when a speeding tempo overturned in front of the Sonargaon Hotel Friday night. He was admitted to the DMCH where he died yesterday morning.

Our Barisal Staff Correspondent adds: One child was killed and 10 others were injured in a road accident at Gouraudia thana of Barisal district yesterday afternoon.

The accident occurred when a Barisal-bound passenger coach fell into a ditch crushing one Shahinur, 10, under the wheels of the bus.

Driver of the bus managed to flee. A case has been filed with the Gouraudia thana.

UNB adds from Chandpur:

Three people were killed and 30 others injured in a road accident at Baburhat on Chandpur-Cormilla road yesterday.

The accident occurred when a Chittagong-bound bus hit a minibus while trying to overtake the vehicle at about 5 pm.

The dead were identified as Abdul Bari, 40, Mujibur Rahman, 15, and Sirajul Haq, 40.

Of the injured, 12 were admitted to Chandpur Sadar Hospital. Three of them were reported to be in critical condition.

Mohammed Ameeruddin, Additional Superintendent of Police, told UNB that all measures have been taken for the burial of the recovered bodies. Local sources said some 200 Rohingyas have taken shelter in Bangladesh territory in last two weeks. On the other hand, in last three weeks, BDR pushed back some 167 Rohingyas who trespassed into Bangladesh territory.

A total of 2.52 lakh Rohingyas took refuge in Bangladesh in 1991-92. Of them, some 53,000 are still housed in eight camps awaiting to be repatriated to their homes in Arakan province of Myanmar. Others have already returned.
