## Delhi hotel blast toll rises to 17

NEW DELHI, Apr 21: Indian police launched an investigation today into an overnight bomb blast which destroyed a hotel in the heart of New Delhi and killed 17 people, including two French nationals and Four Nigerian tourists, reports

A Kashmiri Muslim guerilla group and a Sikh separatist organisation from the state of Punjab jointly claimed responsibility for the Saturday night bombing in the Indian capital's popular tourist district of Pahargani.

Hospital sources said 40 others, including an unspecified number of overseas tourists from countries such as Britain, Iran and the United States were injured when the four-storey Arjun guest house collapsed following the blast.

# Synthetics serious threat to jute products: IJO

Synthetics will remain a se rious threat to jute products at least in the medium term due to vast overcapacity in the manufacturing of polypropylene polymer and prevailing low oil prices, reports UNB.

The warning came in the latest assessment by the International Jute Organisation (IJO) on competitive position of jute vise-a-vis synthetics.

Impost of polymer products have risen sharply in both the developing and the developed countries since the mid eighties as a result of lower rates of synthetics. Consequently, the price

competitiveness of jute waned in the United States and Japan, particularly in the area of carpet backing in the US

According to the IJO, excess capacity of polymer is likely to persist over the next few years despite attempts for rationalisation. The excessive production will keep the price of resin and other synthetic products at low level, pegging the producers, manufactures and exporters of jute and jute goods to a "difficult trading


