**Serve fresh food at DU halls: BCL**

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), the student wing of Bangladesh Awami League yesterday urged the Dhaka University authorities to serve fresh and nutritious food in the dining halls of dormitories.

BCL brought out a procession on the DU campus and then held a rally at the Aparajito Bangla. The rally was addressed by Mahbulul Haq Shakil, Akter Hossain, Shajahan Ali Saju, Bahadur Bepari, Abdul Wadud Khokon and Sazzad Hossain.

BCL leaders alleged that at the armed outsiders forced the managers of the JCD (dominated halls) to serve meals free of cost. The dining managers got no other way but to serve poor quality food to recover the loss, they said.

BSS adds: Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out a procession and held a rally on the Dhaka University campus yesterday demanding sufficient subsidy in food supply in dormitories of the Dhaka University.

He left behind his wife, two sons and a daughter.

Engineer Emdad Ali, who was once the chief engineer of the Water Development Board, also served as the chief engineer of the Provisional Mujibnagar Government in 1971.

Family sources said that Ali was buried at Makkah. The qulkhwaat of Ali will be held after Asr prayers at 45/A, New Eskaton (Hafizabad colony) on April 25.

Khan left behind his wife, a son and two daughters.

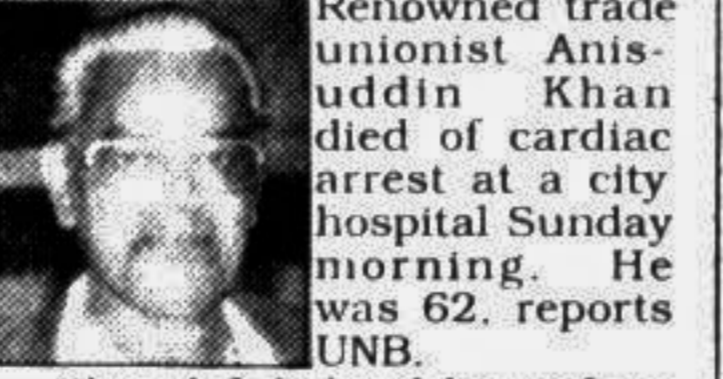
He was buried at Azimpur graveyard Sunday after a namaz-e-janaza at Khilgaon Matir Mosque.
