### BBC renews accord with Radio

An agreement between Bangladesh government and the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) for the relay of BBC World Service radio programmes through Radio Bangladesh was renewed here yesterday for another one year effective from May 1. reports BSS.

The renewal agreement was signed by Joint Secretary, Ministry of Information, Quazi Abdul Bayes and Section Head, Bengali Service of BBC World Service, Peter Mangold at the Conference room of the ministry.

The Information Secretary, Syed Amirul Mulk, Director General of Radio Bangladesh and senior officials of the ministry of Information and the ministry of Bangladesh were present on the occasion.

Under the agreement, the Radio Bangladesh will continue to relay BBC's World Service programmes in Bangla and English for eleven and a half hours daily.

Head of BBC Bengali Service Peter Mangold visited the Mass Communication and Journalism Department of Dhaka University yesterday, reports UNB.

He exchanged views with department's chairman Dr A A M S Arefin Siddique and other faculty members on broadcast of news and news analysis in BBC.

Peter Mangold also talked about FM transmission of BBC Bengali service in and around the capital, said a press release.

### BSP for increase of govt ad rate

Bangladesh Sangbadpatri Parishad (BSP), the association of newspaper owners, has demanded increasing the rate and insertion of government advertisements as well as supply of newsprint as per requirement of the newspapers, reports UNB.

The demands were put forward when a BSP delegation, led by its President Prof Majidul Islam, called on Chief Adviser Muhammad Habibur Rahman at his office yesterday.

The 13-member delegation also apprised the Chief Adviser of various problems of the newspaper industry. Rahman gave them a patient hearing and said he would look into the matters.

### 'Include child rights issue in polls manifestos'

Child participants at a rally yesterday in the city called for the inclusion of the little-addressed issue of child rights in the manifestos of all the political parties contesting the forthcoming general elections.

More than 200 underprivileged children took part in the rally, organised by the Bangladesh Shishu Adhikar Forum (BSAF) in front of the Jatiya Press Club yesterday afternoon.

Speaking on the occasion, child representatives from several member organisations of BSAF, voiced their right to food, shelter, clothing, education and security, and raised issues that violate their rights, including child-trafficking and child labour.

The young speakers urged the country's political leadership to address the issues during election campaigns and include them in their respective manifestos. They also demanded stricter sentences for child-traffickers and equal pay as adults for equal jobs.

A short sketch entitled "Angur Mia's Atya Kahini" (Angur Mia's story) depicting the true story of a child imprisoned for years without being charged — was performed by child actors during the rally.

The organisations working with disadvantaged that participated in the rally are: ARBAN, Shishu Kalyan Trust, Maitri Parishad, Assistance for Slum Dwellers, Nari Maitri, UCEP, BJMAS, and Desh Unnayan Samiti.

### Dr Tozammel Haq dead

Dr Muhammad Tozammel Haq, former chairman, Department of Economics, Rajshahi University, died of cardiac arrest at St Louis Hospital in US yesterday. He was 72, says a press release.

He was also the Provost of Shah Mukhdam Hall and Dean of the Arts Faculty of the university.

He worked with a number of economic and planning bodies affiliated with United Nations and ESCAP from 1967 to 1974.

He did his MA in Economics from the Dhaka University in 1945. He obtained his MSC degree in industrial economics from the London University in 1951.

He served as the regional adviser for industry at UNIDO from 1974-1984.

### Housewife commits suicide in city

A housewife reportedly committed suicide by taking poison at her residence in Konapara area under Demra thana in the city yesterday.

Mother of three, Tahera Khanam 35, wife of one Anwar Hossain, took poison late Tuesday night and died at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) yesterday afternoon, hospital sources said.

Tahera's brother alleged that his sister committed suicide following a conflict with her husband Anwar, a contractor. Anwar often assaulted and tortured his sister, he added.


John J Scott, Canadian High Commissioner in Bangladesh, who was the chief guest at the closing session, lauded the role of MIDAS in economic development and employment generation.
