Election Code of Conduct

The Election Commission (EC) yesterday announced a code of conduct for the contending political parties and candidates in the coming parliamentary elections, reports BSS.

Following is the code of conduct as published in a gazette notification:

Ban on Donation or Subscription: The political parties may announce their overall development planning. But following the announcement of the election schedule till the polling, the contending parties and candidates can not donate or commit to donate any sum of money, publicly or secretly, to any institution of their respective constituencies. During the period they can not commit to adopt any development project in their respective areas.

Use of Dak Bangalows and Rest Houses: All parties and candidates would enjoy equal rights in using government rest houses, circuit houses or dak bangalows on the basis of their application and in accordance with the existing principles in this regard. But officials concerned engaged in election duties will get priority in getting the facilities of rest houses, circuit houses or dak bangalows.

Election Campaign: (1) All political parties and candidates would enjoy equal rights in regard to election campaign. Rallies, processions or other election campaigns of the opponents can not be disrupted or obstructed.

(2) The contending parties and candidates have to inform the date, time and venue of their respective rallies or marches to the police authorities and their opponents ahead of the programmes.

(3) The contending parties and candidates have to inform the time and venue of their rallies much earlier to the police so that the authorities

might take necessary measures for public movement there and ensure law and order.

(4) No public meeting could be held on any road disrupting the movement of people without the permission of appropriate authorities.

(5) Organisers of any rally, meeting or other programme must report to the police if their programme is disturbed by trouble makers. The organisers must not take measures against the trouble makers on their own.

(6) Following the announcement of polling schedule, no political party or candidate can use government media, official transports, government officials or employees or other state facilities.

(7) No posters, leaflets or handbills, can be put on the posters, leaflets of handbills of the rival candidates.

(8) No election camps can be set up on the roads or places of public use. Election camps should be simple, as far as possible, voters can not be entertained with any sort of food or drinks in the election camps.

(9) Government dak bangalows, rest houses, circuit houses or any government offices can not be used as a place for election campaign.

(10) Posters for election campaign must be printed on country-made paper a black and white colour and in no way be more than 22"x18" in size.

(11) No contender should use more than three microphones at a time in his respective area and the use of mike would be limited between 2pm and 8 pm.

(12) Lands, buildings or other movable or immovable property of any citizen must not be damaged in connection with the election and personal peace of any person must not be violated by undesired activities or indiscipline behaviour.

(13) All contenders will refrain from all sorts of wall writings as a means of election campaign.

(14) In the interest of maintaining law and order, no motor vehicles, including motor cycles, can be moved and no sort of firearms or explosives can be carried within the premises of polling centres, no government official or local influential persons can illegally intervene in election activities.

(15) No truck or bus or torch procession on behalf of any candidate can be brought out.

(16) All political parties and candidates will have to cooperate with the officials and employees engaged in election duties to ensure completion of voting in a disciplined manner without any trouble.

(17) No political party or candidate can give any unpalatable or provocative statement and say anything which might hurt the sentiment of the followers of any religion.

(18) No contender in any way will exceed the fixed limit of the election expenditure.

Keeping the Election Free of any Influence: The election must not be influenced by money, weapons, muscle power or local influence.

Access to the Polling Centres: Only the employees and officials engaged in election duties, rival candidates, polling agents and voters will have the right to access to the polling centres. No worker of any political party or candidate will be allowed to move inside the polling centres. Only the polling agents, sitting in their fixed places, would perform their specific duties.

Pre-Polling Irregularities: Violation of any clause of the code will be considered as pre-polling irregularities and any person or political party aggrieved by such violation can apply to the electoral enquiry committee or Election Commission seeking remedy. If the application filed to the Election Commission is found to be objective, the commission might send it to the concerned or any electoral enquiry committee after investigation under Article 91A of the Representation of People Order 1972 (P. O. No 155 of 1972) will submit recommendation to the Commission.

GF resents EC decision

A presidium meeting of the Gano Forum (GF) yesterday expressed its resentment over dropping the provision for banning use of religious places for election campaign in the code of conduct announced by the Election Commission, reports BSS.

The meeting observed that although a consensus was developed among the major political parties during the discussion with the Election Commission over banning election campaign from mosques, mandirs, pagodas, churches and all other places of worship, the EC in the face of threat of certain quarters dropped it finally from the election code of conduct. This is not only tantamount to show disregard towards the majority parties but also generated question about the sovereign power of the EC, the meeting observed.

The meeting termed this decision of the Election Commission as contradictory to the spirit of the Chief Election Commissioner's address to the nation as well as the ideals of liberation struggle.

Parties urged to present stand on CHT issue

Chittagong Hill Tracts National Coordination and Peace Council appealed to all major political parties to present their respective party stand on the Chittagong Hill Tracts issue before the nation ahead of parliament election, reports UNB.

A press release issued Saturday by Subinoy Chakma, Secretary General of the CHT-NPC, said some political parties were making false and misleading commitments in private, which go against country's sovereignty, in the wake of elections.

"Hill Tracts people will build resistance against any evil force patronising the separatists and terrorists of the hilly region," the Peace Council said.

The CHTNPC press release said an international conspiracy was on against the Chittagong Hill Tracts, an inseparable part of Bangladesh.

Hasina condoles death of AL leader

President of Bangladesh Awami League Sheikh Hasina yesterday expressed her deep shock at the death of Sultan Akand, a commissioner of Madaripur pourasava and general secretary of the district Awami League, reports BSS.

She prayed for the peace of the departed soul and expressed heart-felt sympathy for the members of the bereaved family, a party press release said.
