



BB Annual Report, 1994-95 GDP growth static, inflation 5.2pc

Growth of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) remained almost stagnant at 4.4 per cent in fiscal 1994-95 as against 4.2 per cent in the previous year, according to the Annual Report of Bangladesh Bank for 1994-95 released yesterday.

The low growth of the economy during the year was due to extensive damage of crops and disruption of economic activities due to political unrest, the report said.

Agriculture sector showed a negative growth of one per cent which was 0.3 per cent in the previous year, the report said adding that even an agricultural growth equal to previous year would have raised the GDP growth over that of the

Net domestic savings also showed an insignificant increase. From 7.5 per cent of 1994-95
