FIFA for more friendlies

ZURICH. May 9: FIFA, soccer's governing body, said on Thursday it is behind an initiative to stage a series of friendly matches on the divided island of Cyprus, reports Reuter.

FIFA hopes the friendlies will help ease tensions on the Eastern Mediaterranean island which has been partitioned since Turkey invaded and occupied a third of the country in 1974.

"It is a FIFA initiative," said FIFA spokesman Keith Cooper. confirming earlier reports from the semi-official Cyprus New Agency (CNA). "But the official blessing will not come until after the FIFA executive meeting on the last day of the

BEIJING, May 9: China's dual world record holder Wang Junxia said she was still in recovery mode but was hopeful of returning to her best form at the Atlanta Olympic Games starting in July. Xinhua news agency reported on Thursday. says Reuter.

Wang, who strung together a series of poor performances in 1995, clocked the year's tastest times in the 10,000 metres and 5,000 metres at Olympic trials in the eastern city of Nanjing earlier this

"I was in peak form ... when broke the world record. Wang said of smashing the women's 10,000 metres world record at the national titles in 1993 after winning at the Stuttgart World Championships.

"My training now can only be considered as my recovery period. I hope I can recover to my best level," she said.

She ran a world best for 1996 — 31 minutes 1.76 seconds - in a 10,000 metres heat on Tuesday before winning Wednesday's final in a slower 31 minutes 11.59 seconds. Wang's world record is 29 minutes 31.78 seconds.

Wang also holds the world

record in the 3,000 metres. It was sweet revenge for Wang. who led a mutiny in 1994 against the methods of her estranged coach. Ma Junren. She broke away from the


