



# City AL leader shot dead in Agargaon

and ward commissioner A S M Shahabuddin was shot dead by some armed youths at West Agargaon in the city yesterday. The youths called him out

of his residence at about 3.45 pm. fired shots in the chest. head and arms from a close range and fled away. He was rushed to the nearby Ai-Beruni Hospital and then to the Holy Family hospital. He was later shifted to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where doctors declared him dead, his family sources and police said.

Shahabuddin, 45, Information Secretary of the city AL. was commissioner of Ward No 41 covering Agargaon, Taltala and parts of Shyamoli.

Killing of Shahabuddin. which follows the killing of another AL ward commissioner a'ent three months back sparked off widespread protests in the locality as well

This correspondent came across at least five big protest processions in Agargaon, Dhanmondi and Mohammadpur areas last evening. Hazi Abdul Alim, commissioner of Ward No 62 (Lalbagh-Azimpur areas) was shot dead in February last. The connecting road be-


