30 killed, 60 injured in Manikganj bus plunge

MANIKGANJ, June 1: At least 30 people including four women and one child were killed and about 60 injured, 45 of them critically, when a bus fell from a bridge into a canal 35 feet below at Zoka on the Dhaka-Aricha highway today.

Twentyfour people died on the spot as the Aricha-bound bus with over 90 passengers fell down breaking the railing of the bridge and broke into pieces. Six others died on way to or at hospitals.

Most of the victims were from Ghor and Shibbalaya thanas of the district, police and survivors said.

Survivors said the bus, "Nabin Baran" was in high speed while trying to overtake a truck on the bridge, about 10 km from here.

The accident occurred at about 12.30 pm. This was the worst in five years and rated third in terms of casualties in a decade on the Dhaka-Aricha highway, police said.

The seriously injured people were admitted to different hospitals at Manikganj, Uthuli and Dhaka. Of them, 30 were admitted to Manikganj Hospital, 15 to Dhaka Medical College Hospital, six to the Hospital for the Disabled in Dhaka and 10 to Uthuli Health Complex.

Some of the victims have been identified as Javed Mia (50) of village Barangail, Manikganj; Tahajuddin (35) of village Nayabari, Shibbalaya thana; Sadeque Ali (30), Alam (22), Anja (15), Sayedur Rahman (33) all brothers and sister of village Uttar Muriadah, Sundarganj thana of Gaibandha district, Hekmat (50) of village Kalagaria under Shibbalaya thana; Shajahan (19) of village Manik Nagar; Lalima (57) of village Jamsha; Afuz (32) of village Kalagaria, Piar Ali (40) of village Dubladanga under Shibbalaya thana, Gour Chandra

15 election campaigners electrocuted

MYMENSINGH, June 1: At least 15 people were electrocuted and 50 others injured when two buses carrying the supporters of a BNP candidate came in contact with a live high tension wire in Nandail thana of the district today, reports UNB.

Witnesses said the tragic accident occurred when the slogan-chanting BNP workers on the roofs of the two buses got entangled with a hanging high tension electric wire at Syedgaon in Moazzempur union in the afternoon.

Eleven people died on the spot while four others succumbed to severe burn injuries on way to hospital. The victims were mostly teenagers.

Hospital sources identified the dead as: Harun-ur Rashid, See Page 12 col 7

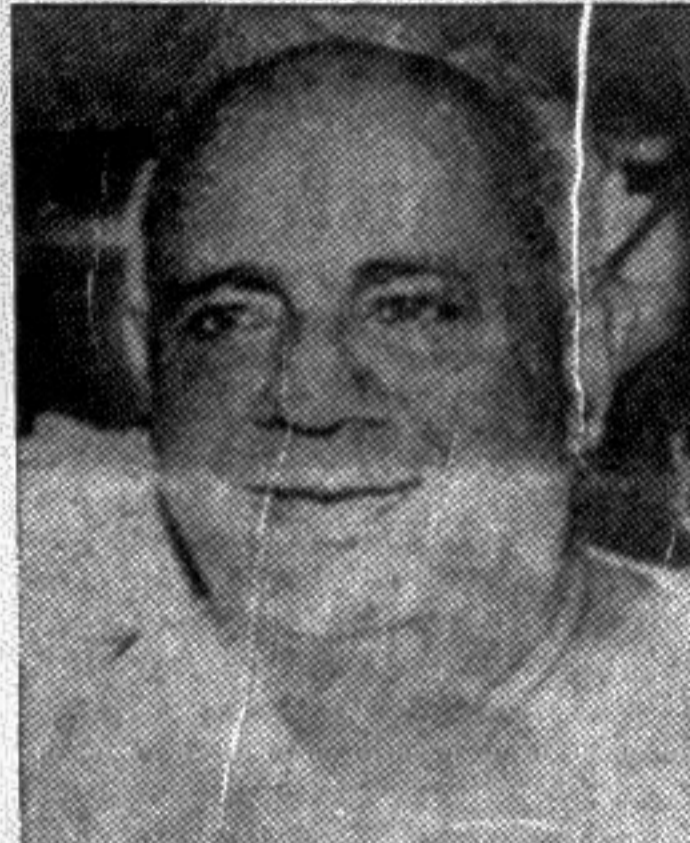
Gowda new Indian PM in 13-member cabinet

NEW DELHI, June 1: H D Deve Gowda, a farmer's son from humble beginnings, was sworn in as India's 11th prime minister here today as the head of a five-party United Front Coalition government, reports AFP.

Deve Gowda, 63, took the oath of office from President Shankar Dayal Sharma at a 30-minute ceremony at the presidential palace, four days after forcing the resignation of the country's first Hindu nationalist government.

He replaced Atal Bihari Vajpayee, whose pro-Hindu Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government resigned on May 28 after just 13 days in office after failing to win majority support in parliament.

Deve Gowda, a greenhorn in national politics, was the surprise choice for the prime ministership of the centrist-leftist United Front alliance after a communist leader and a See Page 12 Col 3

Operation at DMCH suspended

The admission of patients requiring operation was suspended at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) from yesterday, according to authoritative hospital sources.

Only serious patients will, however, be admitted for operation.

Of the total 12 General Operation Theatres (GOT), operation is now being done in only one, said a senior official of the hospital adding that conducting operations in the remaining GOTs are full of risks and hazards.

The GOTs in some cases do not have adequate supply of water while power failure and defective electric lines have made others unsuitable for operation.

CEC unhappy over lapses in arms recovery drive

KHULNA, June 1: Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Muhammad Abu Hena today expressed anguish at the lapses in the arms-recovery drive aimed at creating a violence-free atmosphere for June 12 voting, reports UNB.

"I am really worried and anxious over the issue," said the CEC barely 11 days ahead of the general election, being held under a caretaker administration to make the polls impartial, free and fair.

The operation must be geared up, he said at a meeting here this morning, directing the law-enforcing agencies to strictly maintain law and order for a peaceful conduct of the forthcoming polls.

He said hoodlums and terrorists are neither the friends of anyone nor the members of any political party. "They must be caught."

After takeover of the caretaker government on March 30, a special drive was launched on April 1 to cleanse the country of illegal arms to ensure a free and fair voting.

Till May 31, law-enforcers had recovered a total of 3,508 firearms and arrested 1284 people on charge of possessing illegal arms. Some 24,097 others were also rounded up during the period.

BNP hatching conspiracy to sabotage polls: Hasina

Awami League president Sheikh Hasina yesterday accused the BNP of hatching a conspiracy to frustrate the coming election by unleashing killing and terrorism, reports UNB.

"BNP is cooking up conspiracy to sabotage the June 12 election and destroy democracy, independence and sovereignty of the country," she said addressing a huge election projection meeting at the Kamrangirchar Ashrafabad maidan in Lalbagh thana yesterday afternoon.

Hasina castigated the President for what she said hatching conspiracy against democracy and the voting rights of the people sitting inside Bangladesh.

She also charged a leader of a particular political party with selling out the country's independence and sovereignty and trying to uproot democracy from the soil of this land.

Referring to the killing of Shahabuddin, the ward commissioner of Agargaon area, the Awami League chief observed that the brutality and ruthlessness of the killing signalled the conspiracy of a particular quarter to foil the polls.

She appealed to the people to give their verdict against "this conspiracy," saying that

Pre-polls violence in some Ctg JS seats

CHITTAGONG, June 1: Pre-polls violence sparked off tension in some of the trouble-prone constituencies here while the electioneering continued in full swing.

The constituencies which already were rocked by incidents of violence included Raozan (Chittagong-6), Rangunia (Chittagong-7), Patiya (Chittagong-11) and Chandgaon-Boalkhali (Chittagong-10), according to police and political sources.

Police officials said special measures were being taken to prevent any fresh outbreak of violence in those areas.

Supporters of Awami League and BNP trade gunfire at Chowdhuryhat and Nayahat areas of Raozan on Friday afternoon, police and local people said. But no casualty was reported.

The violence erupted there when the local BNP candidate started a mass contact programme.

The situation was brought under control after police arrived at the spot. Similar incidents of violence also took place in Raozan on May 22.

Both AL and BNP blamed each other for the incidents. In Chandgaon residential area, a clash took place on Friday between two groups of activists of BCL and JCD while posters of AL candidate Nurul Islam were being pasted on the wall, local people said. During the clash at least 10 people received minor injuries and some posters were damaged. When police rushed to the spot the clashing groups fled.

On Thursday, a clash ensued at Patiya when some posters of Jatiya Party candidate Shamsul Alam Master were damaged by rival supporters. JP blamed the activists of BNP for damaging the posters and centring the incidents a clash erupted between See Page 12 Col 1

We will revive Gram Sarkar if voted to power: Khaleda

KALIGANJ, Gazipur, June 1: BNP Chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia today said her party, if voted to power again, would ensure the involvement of elected representatives in every tier of government down to the village for infusing dynamism in development work, reports UNB.

Addressing an electioneering meeting at Chupair High School ground in the afternoon, she said the BNP would revive Gram Sarkar (village government) system while elected people would be put on the Thana Development Council and District Council.

"We'll attach special importance to strengthening local leadership so that people at grass-roots level can participate in the development process," the former prime minister said, explaining her party's future programme.

Begum Zia said the food for education programme, which has been making a tremendous contribution to spread education, particularly in the rural areas, would further be expanded to all unions of the country.

Besides, she vowed, the opportunity of free education and stipend for the girl students would be extended up to intermediate level in a bid to spread education among womenfolk who would in turn help build an educated society.

The BNP chief also told the electorates that her party would also introduce pension for the elderly poor citizens See Page 12 col 6
