Free, fair polls essence of democracy, seminar told

Speakers at a seminar in the city yesterday observed that a free and fair election is the essence of democracy.

They said a political system is democratic to the extent that its powerful collective decision makers are selected through fair, honest and periodic elections.

The Bangladesh Political Science Association (BPSA) organised the day-long seminar on "Election 1996, and Future of Democracy in Bangladesh". It was chaired by Prof Rafigul Islam Chowdhury, VC.

Chittagong University. Prof Ataur Rahman, general secretary of BPSA presented the key-note paper in the first session of the seminar on "Bangladesh in 1996: In Search of a Free and Fair Elec-

Prof Saifullah Bhuiyan of DU. Dr Abdur Rab Khan, BIISS Dr Mostafa Chowdhury of DU Prof AKM Shahidullah of DU. Prof Abdul Hakim of CU, Dr Dilara Chowdhury of JU and Dr Abtab Ahmad of DU took part in the discussion.

Dr Ataur Rahman in his paper observed that Bangladesh started its journey with a democratic government - the first election in independent Bangladesh was held on March 7. 1973.

Prof Abtab quoting from va vrious newspaper reports. sa, 'd the election was rigged in var lous ways despite the fact Sheikh Mujib's charisma AL's strong party network would have given the ruling party i in absolute majority any

There? was a presidential election in June 1978 and a parliame ntary election in 1979. Alle gations of massive rigging were also recorded in these elections.

He said there were allegations of questionable polling practices in all the elections except in 1991 held under a neutral caretaker government

after the fall of Ershad He said the holding of parlian sentary election on February 15 to fulfill a constitutional obligation in the face of oppositicm movement created dish armony in the political

He said, the myth that the burea ucracy is neutral has been proved wrong in Bangladesh when civil servants refused to

work on security grounds.

The political power of the military in Bangladesh is a reality, he said. Without the active cooperation of the military-bureaucratic establishment, the search for a free and fair election under a non-party caretaker government seems to be an elusive

goal, he observed. The inaugural session of the day-long session was chaired by DU VC Prof Emajuddin Ahmed. Justice Mostafa Kamal was present as the chief guest. In his speech Justice Mostafa Kamal said the future

of the democracy does not de-

pend on a particular election. Giving examples from different countries rich with democratic culture he said. the success of democracy depends on many factors. Free and fair election is one of them.

He said there must be democratic practices in the political parties.

Law & order situation not favourable for polls: LDF

Left Democratic Front yesterday observed that the prevailing law and order situation of the country was not favourable for holding a peaceful election as the authorities had failed to clean the ground. reports UNB.

At a press conference, LDF Coordinator Khalequzzaman Bhuiyan said violent incidents were increasing alarmingly due to lack of effective measures to recover illegal arms.

He referred to the killing of a ward commissioner in the city in broad daylight on Friday, and said the law-enforcing agencies had failed to arrest the armed hoodlums.

Bhuiyan alleged that the election rules and code of conduct had become a mockery as some candidates, particularly of four major parties, do not at all pay heed to those

He said the Election Commission was doing nothing but warning the violators. As a result. Bhuiyan said, the extent of thumping the rules is increasing.

The LDF coordinator further said the EC had failed to bar loan defaulters from contesting the election. "The defaulting candidates are now engaged in a game of black money in the name of elec-

As such, Khalequzzaman Bhuiyan said, the expectation of the people for a fair and impartial election would not be fulfilled in the June 12 polls.

He said the Left Democratic Front had tried to meet the Chief Election Commissioner to put forward their allegations and recommendations, but he (CEC) did not give an appointment

He held the country's existing undemocratic, exploitative and autocratic system responsible for the present situation and said, people's emancipation from this system would not be possible through such an election.

The LDF coordinator cautioned that the crisis confronting the nation would deepen if anyone of the major parties returned to power. He called for choosing an alternative force like Left Democratic Front other than these parties.

Addressing the press conference front leader Hasanul Haq Inu said the caretaker government failed to create a completely congenial atmosphere for holding a free and fair election.

He criticised the role played by two major parties after the incidents that happened in the army on May 20, terming their reaction in this regard unwanted.

Opinion poll: Both AL, BNP to get 29pc votes

Both BNP and Awami League (AL) will attract equal support in the June 12, according to an opinion poll conducted by an independent research organisation. Bangladesh Unnayan Parishad

The poll conducted on .449 respondents in 13 constituencies of Dhaka revealed that these two parties would get 29 per cent of the votes. while Jatiya Party will get five per cent votes. Jamaat-e-Islami will get two per cent and other parties will get one per cent of the votes.

However, 13 per cent of the respondents said they are not yet decided as to which party to vote for while 21 per cent did not respond.

About the performance of the caretaker government, 70 per cent of the respondents said they were satisfied with the performance of the caretaker government, with another 21 per cent more or less satisfied. Only two per cent expressed dissatisfaction.

In response to another question, it has been found that of those respondents who voted in the February 1991 elections, 48 per cent voted for BNP, while 19 per cent voted for AL, with 28 per cent did not answer the question.

"It appears that there has been a significant increase in the support for the AL compared to 1991, while the opposite is the case with BNP. the findings said.


