Democracywatch survey reveals

AL leads BNP by 2 pc: 13 pc hangs in the balance

pected to get an absolute ma jority in the seventh parliament, the Awami League (AL) gains an edge of two per cent over the BNP in an opinion poll released here yesterday. However, a comparison of

the survey findings with that of 1991 elections shows that BNP and Jativa Party (JP) have improved their positions by five and four per cent, while AL and Jamaat-e-Islami (JI) have lost by one and seven per cent respectively. The survey conducted by

the Social Surveys, the polling operation of Democracywatch and an associate of Gallup International - covered 32 marginal constituencies where in 1991 election the difference between the winner and the loser was less than 3,000 votes. For their third nationwide survey, the pollster interviewed 12, 578 voters. Of the interviewees. 75 per cent live in rural areas and 25 per cent in urban areas while 68 per cent are men and 32 per cent women.

The AL would bag 31 per cent votes while 29 per cent of respondents would cast their vote for BNP, 17 per cent for JP, six per cent for JI, 13 per cent of respondents are yet to decide which party they would

"It seems that over the last two weeks there has been a slight shift in favour of AL and JP, while BNP and JI have held their position," said Shafiq Rehman, the director of the organisation, who presented the findings of the survey. "The ultimate results may

be decided by a large number of voters (13 per cent) who have not yet made up their mind. However, the class composition of voters (illiterate, farmers, students and housewives) may favour in the election day." Rehman observed.

Thirty-eight per cent of respondents considered education, intellect and honesty, 26 per cent party nomination, 25 per cent development work in the constituency and six percent family background as the criteria before voting for a candidate

Although no party is ex- Compared to our survey in May more voters are now opting for candidate's education intellect as the foremost qualification." commented Rehman.

The survey found that Al was drawing more support from literate, professionals businessmen, employees and unemployed voters while BNP trying to woo the farmers, students and housewives.

The aged and the rich favoured AL while majority of the youths and the poor would cast their votes for BNP, the

While urban voters are equally split between AL and BNP, the poll suggests a minor shift in favour of AL among the rural voters

Asked if the election would be peaceful, 85 per cent of the respondents replied in the affirmative while six per cent in the negative A total of 63 per cent of the

respondents said that army should be deployed to maintain peace during the election while 23 per cent rejected the

In response to a question as to what would be the state of the country after the election, 68 per cent of the respondents said "better." eight per cent "same as before," and three per cent "worse". Some 21 per cent of the respondents are not sure about the post-election-situation-

"Compared to our survey in May, this shows voters are now more optimistic about the future." Rehman observed.




