

## Opponents polluting fair polls environment, alleges Nasim

SIRAJGANJ, June 8: Awami League central leader and candidate for the Sirajganj-1 and 2 constituencies expressed his fear that the elections in his constituencies might not be fair as his opponents had already polluted the environment with 'black money'.

At a press conference, Mohammad Nasim said that some of his opponents were offering money to voters.

He said, some terrorists were threatening voters to cast their votes in favour of those opponents.

Rickshawpullers in Sirajganj town were offered money and given banners to campaign in favour of those candidates, Nasim alleged.

"I urge foreign and local polls observers to come to Sirajganj on the election day and see for themselves if things are alright here," Nasim pointed out.

The press conference was held at Nasim's election office here. It was attended among others by district AL President Motaah H Talukdar.

Mohammad Nasim is contesting against BNP's Shamsul AL-Amin and JP's Prof MA Matin in Sirajganj-2 seat.

## Patuakhali: 10 hurt in pre-polls violence

BARISAL, June 8: At least 10 persons were injured, 3 of them seriously, in a pre-polls violence and clash between Awami League and Bangladesh Nationalist Party supporters at Sreerampur Village under Sadar thana of Patuakhali district on Thursday night.

The clash erupted following altercation between the two rival party supporters centring a procession. Several bombs were exploded during the clash.

Seriously injured Mannan Chowdhury, 45, Abdus Salam, 25 and Mizanur Rahman, 27, were admitted to Patuakhali Sadar Hospital. Two separate cases were lodged by AL and BNP in this connection.

## Student killed in Bogra

BOGRA, June 8: A beheaded body of a student was recovered from a rooftop of a one-storied building at Temple road in the town on Friday, reports UNB.

Police, acting on a tip-off, searched the different rooms of the building and recovered the body of Nikhil, 23, first year student of Government Azizul Haq College, from its rooftop.

The residence is being used as district Rickshaw Samik Union office for a long time, police said.

Police arrested two people for interrogation in this connection.

JP would emerge as single largest party, if Ershad was released: Mizan

MOULVIBAZAR, June 8: Acting chairman of Jatiya Party Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury has said, questions might arise about the neutrality of the caretaker government if JP chairman H M Ershad was not allowed to take part in the electioneering.

Chowdhury claimed that JP would emerge as the single largest party in the coming election. "If Ershad is released, JP would sweep the election," he said.

The JP acting chairman Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury was addressing a public meeting in favour of local JP candidate at Moulvibazar Pourashava Shishu Park Wednesday evening.

He called upon the people to vote for Jatiya Party in the coming polls as also to voice their protest against corruption of the BNP government during the last five years. He said, due to mismanagement of the BNP government the country had turned into an Indian market and many factories were closed down.

## Double murder in Sirajganj: Miscreants yet to be arrested


SIRAJGANJ, June 8: Even after a week the mystery of the double murder on Bogra-Nagarbari highway was not yet unearthed and none was arrested in this connection, reports UNB.

Police said a gang of four youths killed a micro bus driver, Abdus Salam, 35, hailed from Faridpur and his helper, Anwar, 34, from Kushtia, in the evening on May 29 on the highway.

On the following day, police recovered the bodies under the two bridges Salami from Boalia bridge in Ullapra thana and Anwar from Bhuiyanganati bridge in Rajganj.

Earlier, the youths hired the micro bus from a 'Rent-a-Car' in Mohammadpur of the capital city and left Dhaka for Bogra through Aricha-Nagarbari road.

Police could not yet recover the micro bus. The case, however, was handed over to the CID for investigation.

# China virus kill huge quantity of shrimp fry in Cox's Bazar

COX'S BAZAR, June 8: Shrimp fry worth worth taka several crores died of water borne disease that broke out in an epidemic form in Cox's Bazar district. "China virus" disease has taken serious turn in sadar thana and other parts of this district.

Shrimp farmers said that the shrimp being affected with this disease become weak and float on the surface of the water and gradually die. This disease started from first week of April, this year according to local shrimp businessmen.

The disease caused heavy loss to the shrimp project owners during the current season. Most of the shrimp culturists with the hope of good output had invested a huge amount of money and brought their projects under semi-intensive and improved culture programmes. But the China virus disease, second of its kind, threw them into a state of frustration.

Meanwhile, the shrimp farmers used Oxi-Tetacycline medicine for prevention of the disease but to no effect. Project owners said that, no medicine was available in Bangladesh to cure the disease. Some unscrupulous traders

taking advantage of the situation have been engaged in selling adulterated medicines. In the meantime, Cholera Research Centre, recently conducted chemical tests which reveal that dangerous bacteria diseases namely vibrio and salmonella were found in the shrimps affected with the disease.

The local fishery experts said that environmental imbalance, use of polluted water and improper nursing of fry, were the main causes of the diseases.

The area of land used for shrimp cultivation is increasing every year. Sea water is coming up in the lower stream. Salinity is drawing many entrepreneurs to shrimp cultivation. A huge quantity of money is being invested in shrimp culture. Government machinery is already supporting the shrimp cultivation. But very alarming situation has arisen in production of shrimp in Cox's Bazar region.

It is apprehended that the shrimp culture will be limited to half of the total area of the normal shrimp cultivation during the current season. The season has started last week of March this year but no fry of

the tiger shrimp was available to the owners of shrimp enclosures in the Cox's Bazar region.

This unprecedented situation has been created out of catching excessive frog and that too in an unplanned manner by fishermen in the Bay Bengal as well as in other coastal belt of the county for the last one decade.

It was learnt from a source close to the Chokoria Sundarban area that 'mother' shrimp releases very small quantity of fry in the Bay of Bengal area. These fry grow inside the rivers and canals of the Cox's Bazar area along the coastal belt and once again these fry after their maturity return to the sea. The some fry come floating from the sea of the rivers of the coastal belt. Catching of these fry was unabated since the beginning of the decade of 80s.

The landless farmers having maximum of 50 decimal of land engaged previously in agro-based activities, now have no daily work. Not only that, they have also lost their homestead garden, trees, cattle milk and sweet water. Experts say the total earning is going to entrepreneurs but landless

people, marginal farmers and small farmers are losing their jobs, their agro-based social system and earning pattern.

A huge amount of foreign exchange can be earned from shrimp export if modern method of shrimp culture is adopted.

They newly introduced semi-intensive shrimp culture on small scale as test case by some people of Cox's Bazar with the financial and technical assistance from the BSCIC increases production by at least 25 times compared to the traditional method.

About 2.25 lakh acres of land in the coastal region of the country has been brought to shrimp culture. The shrimp produced in saline water in the traditional method is popularly known as 'black tiger' in the United States.

The yield is only 75 kilograms per acre on an average but the semi intensive method produces as high as 3,000 kilograms per acre which is very low compared to a South Asian average of 1500 kilograms.

The shrimp cultivated areas are concentrated in Chokoria, Maheshkhali, sadar Thana, Ukhiya and Teknaf.

## Candidates directed to refrain from filing false complaint

JHALAKATI, June 8: Election Commission directed the candidate of Jhalakati-1 constituency Major (retired) M Shaha-jahan Omar on Tuesday to refrain from filing any false complaint, reports UNB.

Shaha-jahan Omar, a BNP candidate from the Rajapur-Kathalia constituency lodged a complaint with the district Electoral Inquiry Committee on May 22 in which he said a group of armed men led by Awami League candidate Abdul Mannan attacked his residence on May 19 night injuring 17 BNP workers.

But, the committee found the allegation false after examining the witnesses and records and directed the complainant not to file such false complaint in future.

## Arms-recovery drive not satisfactory in N-dists

NATORE, June 8: With three days left for the June 12 parliamentary election, the arms-recovery drive in the country's 16 northern districts could not make any significant headway, reports UNB.

Official sources said 168 firearms were recovered from the districts till May 31 while police made a list of 7,500 'terrorists', including 5,000 unauthorised arms holders.

As the arms recovery drive began on April 1, most of the criminals, who were unleashing a reign of terror in 128 thana headquarters of the districts, have gone into hiding with their firearms, they said.

"We are satisfied with the arms recovery rate in Rajshahi division and hope that the armed terrorists will not be able to influence the June 12 election," said a police officer who preferred not to be named.

## Employees of FP deptt not getting wages for 3 months

JHENIDAH, June 8: Employees of Family Planning (FP) Department in Jhenidah district have been deprived of monthly salary for last three months, it was learnt from the concerned sources. According to reports a total of 693 employees consisting of Family Welfare Assistants (FWA), Family Welfare Visitors (FWV), Family Planning Inspectors (FPI), Medical Assistants (MA) and Security Guards of the department are passing their days in hardship for want of salaries since last three months.

When contacted the Deputy Director, Family Planning, Jhenidah district admitted the fact and told that no fund was allocated for those employees since March this year.

# Election scene in Jamalpur dist

JAMALPUR, June 8: With only three days left for the parliamentary elections, election campaign in the district has gained a fresh impetus, as candidates and workers are visiting door-to-door day and night to persuade voters in their favour.

The urban and rural areas at Jamalpur district are now humming with election goings. Realising the importance of the ensuing JS polls people are discussing the merits and demerits of candidates.

All most all the main stream political alliances opened election offices at different places and making public contacts in favour of their respective candidates.

In 1991 parliamentary election Awami League, captured three constituencies, out of five constituencies, other two seats went to BNP.

BNP secretary general Salam Talukdar from Jamalpur-4 and ex-deputy minister for health Md Serajul Haq from Jamalpur-5 are contesting

among other contestants.

In their election campaign in the district, BNP nominees are trying to bank on the damages caused by the opposition parties especially during the recent non-cooperation movement.

On the contrary, candidates of AL and other parties are mainly concentrating on issues like political killings, armed terrorism and political administration during BNP rule. They are also trying to highlight failure of BNP during its rule to develop road communication of west Jamalpur district.

In the 1991 election, BNP bagged two out of five seats, while AL won three seats. But this time internal feud in Awami League and BNP have figured prominently making of quite uncertain who has better chance of winning seats.

On the other hand, Awami League could not gain expected result in 1991, election despite organised campaign due to a negative issue resist boat by their opponent.

In Jamalpur-1 (Dewanganj-Bakshiganj) thanas constituency hard contest may take place between Awami League and Jatiya Party. AL candidate is Abul Kalam Azad and JP candidate and ex-minister is MA Sattar. Both the candidates are cousin brothers. Other candidates who are contesting from the seat are AK Mainul Haque (BNP), Professor Osman Ghani (Jamaat), Abdur Rashid Dula (Independent), Badul Chisty (Independent).

In Jamalpur-2 (Islampur) thana constituency six candidates of main political alliances appeared as contesting candidates. However main battle is likely to take place between BNP candidate Sultan Muhammad Batre and AL candidate Al-Haj Rushad Mosharrar. On the other hand, Jamaat, Jatiya Party, Communist Party and Jaker Party candidates are no less important than the AL, BNP candidates here, political observers view.

In Jamalpur-3 (Melandah and Madarganj) thanas five

candidates are contesting for the seats.

The candidates are, Abdul Hai Bacchu Mia (BNP), Mirza Azam (AL), Professor Nuruddin Miah (Jamaat), Shafiqul Islam (JP) Haroon-or-Rashid (Muslim League) and Nayeem Jahangir (Left-Front).

BNP candidate Abdul Hai Bacchu Miah will have to face tough competition fighting strong AL candidate Mirza Azam.

In Jamalpur-4 (Sarishabari) constituency, BNP candidate Salam Talukdar is contesting against ex-upazila chairman AL candidate Moulana Nurul Islam who is also considered to be a strong candidate, political leaders said.

In Jamalpur-5 (Jamalpur sadar constituency) hard contest may take place between BNP candidates ex-minister Serajul Haq and AL candidate district AL secretary Rezaul Karim Hire Miah.

According to observers, a neck and neck fight is likely among the candidates of AL and BNP in all the seats of the district.

## Black money holders controlling economy of country: Azam

SIRAJGANJ, June 8: Ameer of Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh, Prof. Golam Azam said yesterday that several thousand neo capitalists and holders of black money were now controlling the economy of Bangladesh, reports BSS.

He was addressing five big election meetings at Sirajganj college ground, Belkuchi college ground, Akbar Ali college ground under Ullapra thana, Dhongora High School field under Rajganj thana and Rupsi High School field under Shahzadpur thana.

Prof Azam said the interest-based capitalist economic system has given birth to a self-centred opportunist class in the society. Peasants were groaning under the pangs of low prices of their produce and high production cost following withdrawal of subsidy on agriculture, he added.

He said, various industries, including jute, textiles, sugar and handloom were now on the verge of collapse and blamed the past government for the present deplorable condition of these industries. Only a welfare Islamic government could reverse the trend and take the country on the road to progress and prosperity, he maintained.

The Jamaat chief said the country had to witness two general elections in the short span of four months only due to the 'obstinacy' of a lady having been elected to power in the election held under a caretaker government. BNP had refused to accept the national demand for a caretaker gov-

ernment. To realise the demand for a caretaker government for establishing people rights 150 persons had to sacrifice their lives and national wealth worth crores of taka were destroyed, he said.

Prof. Azam said those who snatched the voting rights of the people by holding 'farical' election on February 15 had no right to seek mandate of the people in the coming election of June 12.

He said if people abide by the rule of Allah they would live peacefully, both in this world and the world here after. Otherwise, they would face unrest in this world and severe punishment in Akherat, he said.

The Jamaat chief called upon the people to vote for 'scale' to establish the rule of Allah.

## Contraband items recovered, 3 held in Magura

MAGURA, June 8: Task Force members in a drive arrested three shopowners and recovered Indian contraband goods worth about Tk 15,800 on Monday, reports UNB.

Police said the task force led by a first class Magistrate raided different shops in the town and seized the goods.

The arrested Shahinur, Abul Hossain and Kamal Hossain were sent to jail hatat.

A case was lodged with the police.

## Elections : Kushtia 8.4 lakh voters ready to elect 4 MPs

KUSHTIA, June 8: All preparations are afoot to hold the June 12 elections here. A total of 8 lakh 40 thousand 750 voters of Kushtia district are going to elect 4 MPs by casting their votes in 414 voting centres in the 7th Jatio Sangsad Election.

Deputy Commissioner and District Returning Officer sought active cooperation of all sections of people in peaceful holding of the election and expected that maximum number of voters will turn up to exercise their right of franchise. He said that adequate measures have been taken to maintain the secrecy of casting votes and prevention of fake vote casting.

Voting centres will be protected by adequate number of the members of the law enforcing agencies.

The election office source said that total number of male voters is 4 lakh 28 thousand 966 while 4 lakh 17 thousand 749 are female. Total voting centres in the district is 414 while number of booths is 1673 where a total of 414 presiding officers and 1673 assistant presiding officers will be engaged.

The total number of polling officers is 3346. The break-up of the 4 constituencies is as follows: Kushtia 1 constituency consists of Daulatpur thana, its total number of voters is one lakh 91 thousand 441. Out of that male voters are 94 thousand, 437, while female voters

are 97 thousand. Total number of voting centres is 102 while number of polling booths is 383. Presiding officer 102, assistant presiding officers 383 and polling officers 766.

Kushtia 2 constituency consists of Mirpur and Bhermara thanas where total number of voters is 2 lakh 29 thousand 281 out of which male voters are one lakh 15 thousand 443 and female voters are one lakh 13 thousand 838. Total number of voting centres is 108 while number of polling booths is 460. There are 108 presiding officers, 460 assistant presiding officers and 920 polling officers.

Kushtia 3 constituency consists of Kushtia sadar thana where total number of voters is 2 lakh 17 thousand 655. Out of that male voters are one lakh 11 thousand while female voters are one lakh 6 thousand 555. Total number of voting centres is 108 and number of polling booths is 435. There are 108 presiding officers 435 assistant presiding officers and 870 polling officers.

Kushtia 4 constituency consists of Khokha and Kumarkhali thanas where total number of voters is 2 lakh 2 thousand 338. Out of that male voters are one lakh 2 thousand 86 while female voters are one lakh two hundred fifty two. Total number of voting centres in 97 and number of polling booths is 395. There are 97 presiding officers 395 assistant presiding officers and 790 polling officers.
