## Five out of 36 women candidates win polls

Five out of 36 women candidates, who contested in the Wednesday's parliamentary elections, won from 11 constituencies, according to the Election Commission's unofficial results of 271 constituencies, reports UNB.

The winners, who defeated their male rivals, were from the Awami League, BNP and Jatiya Party.

Awami League President Sheikh Hasina won all the three seats she contested while BNP Chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia won from all her five constituencies.

Jatiya Party's senior president member Begum Raushan Ershad, who contested from four constituencies, won only one seat (Mymensingh-4). She was beaten in the other three (Mymensingh-1, Mymensingh-

11 and Sherpur-1) seats.

The other two winners were Begum Motiha Chowdhury of the Awami League and Khurshid Jahan Huq of the BNP.

Motia Chowdhury won the Sherpur-2 seat while Khurshid Jahan the Dinajpur-3 constituency defeating their rival BNP and Awami League candidates respectively.

Of the 36 women candidates, Gano Forum nominated the highest seven, but none was successful in the June 12 election.

The Awami League had four candidates, BNP 3, Jatiya Party 3, other smaller parties 15 and independents 4.

## Reelection in Ctg-13 demanded

CHITTAGONG, June 14: Al-haj Nazrul Islam Chowdhury, who had contested the election from Chittagong-13 (Chandanaish) constituency on Awami League ticket, today demanded re-election in some 34 centres of ten unions, in the just concluded parliamentary election of June 12, reports BSS.

Addressing a press conference at Chittagong Press Club, Chowdhury alleged widespread terrorism, false voting and the capturing of the vote centre by what he said. "The identified hoodlums of his rival BNP candidate and former minister Oli Ahmed.

He said BNP workers, in collaboration with a good number of presiding officers, resorted to unfair means and violence to manipulate the polls results in favour of BNP candidate.

Chowdhury also alleged that a group of observers from FEMA polls monitoring team in disguise of Chittagong Dal workers using motorcycles resorted to massive terrorism in at least 20 centres in the constituency. He also alleged that most of the presiding officers have been appointed from educational institutions, which were founded by Oli Ahmed during his tenure as cabinet member.

He said, in North Bainjuri Primary School Centre, the supporters of BNP candidate fired at least 20 rounds of gunshots and also exchanged fire with the members of law enforcement agencies. They also blasted bombs in several villages of minority communities in the early hours of Wednesday.

## 66 rounded up

Police rounded up 66 people on various charges from different parts of city during the last 24 hours till 6 pm yesterday, reports UNB.
