## Views on the Election

Following is a reaction to the recent election. It will not be suitable for those who are looking for news.

Four Corners: Dinajpur, Sylhet division, CHT, Khulna, Jessore, Faridpur  
Center: Dhaka Division except Faridpur  
East: Barisal Division, Chittagong Division except CHT  
West: Kushtia, Rajshahi Division except Dinajpur and Rangpur

Remark 1:  
AL has strong and stable (91 and 96) support in the four corners.

BNP won over AL with wide margin in the center, east, and west in 91. They still have majority in the east and west. However, they lost miserably in the center. Geographically, their defeat in 96 can be attributed to the loss of support in the center.

[Aside: I think in almost all the elections the winning side also won in the center. Looks reasonable to assume that (i) the center represents Bangladesh more closely and (ii) changes in popularity starts spreading from the center.]

JP has strong and stable support in Rangpur (and only in Rangpur and few other constituencies). JI had no geographic pattern in 91 (no mention 96).

Remark 2:  
Most people who are perceived corrupt have lost. This was observed in 91 as well, although not as clearly as it is in 96. Many people with name and fame are actually well known for their corruption. Bangladeshi voters are showing increasing awareness against corruption

Remark 3:  
Ref. remarks 1 and 2. BNP has lost a number of seats (which they won in 91) mostly due to perceived corruption. However, party image of BNP is, in general, good. People have (i) thanked BNP for their good performance, (ii) condemned BNP candidates perceived corrupt, and (iii) blamed AL for their strategies.

Remark 4:  
Ref. remarks 1 and 2. New seats of AL are not only won against BNP candidates (ministers) perceived corrupt. This includes many other constituencies. A general trend is to (i) condemn using religion in politics and (ii) welcome pro-liberation forces in power. One minor factor may be (iii) sympathy to AL for various reasons including their remaining out of power for 21 years, apology, etc.

Remark 5:  
Ref. remark 1. By result, JP is only a regional party. Not to mention this is not so by ideology. This is a nice opportunity for them to turn their party into a regional one.

Remark 6:  
Ref. remark 4. From the national perspective, one important factor behind win of AL is their appeal for pro-liberation government. In fact, choices made in 47, 54, 70, 73, 78, 91, and 96 suggest that the most important factor from the national perspective is the desire for greater freedom and prestige — not the basic needs (if you question validity of 78, do it). But tell me which side people should choose at that time from the same perspective.

Conclusion:  
Performance of BNP in government has been appreciated. Success of honesty and failure of corruption should be crystal clear by now. Hope, next time they will try not to nominate people perceived corrupt. It's now an excellent opportunity for them to perform well in the opposition. They can't go back to the past and lead the war of liberation. This is reality. Only way they can make a comeback is to prove that they are better.

I have no idea how AL is going to make much difference in the performance in govt. Poverty and illiteracy are two barriers that will come in the way of doing something truly remarkable. Maybe we can hope for minimization of mistrust and hatred, better law and order, and less corruption. Also, people will find a different taste in the revival of 71-er chetona. They are matured now. Hope, they will be able to avoid excessive use of it.

## Bangladesh Joins Information Superhighway

Can anyone give any information about the online internet connection in Bangladesh? I have heard that Bangladesh is now connected online. Anybody know what is the address?

The company that has started providing on-line internet connection in Bangladesh via VSAT is "Information Network Services Limited (INS)", situated at TMC Building near Bangla Motor. Their domain name is bangla.net. You can browse their web page at www.bangla.net.

They are taking the internet service from a University at Hongkong.

Local providers are going to subscribe nodes from INS to provide on-line connection to their own users/subscribers. Their charges are:  
Tk. 10,000 for membership (one time)  
Tk. 5,000 for security  
Tk. 1,000 for 4 hours on-line internet connection per month  
Tk. 3 per minute after 4-hours passes.

They are also charging Tk. 300 per hour for persons who use the ISN internet booths at the ISN office premises.

However, a local provider Agni says that they will charge less just for e-mail and equal for on-line connection. They will not charge the 10,000+5,000. Also, another firm Citech is in the line to provide the on-line facility. They are in the stage of checking their setup and will be in operation shortly.

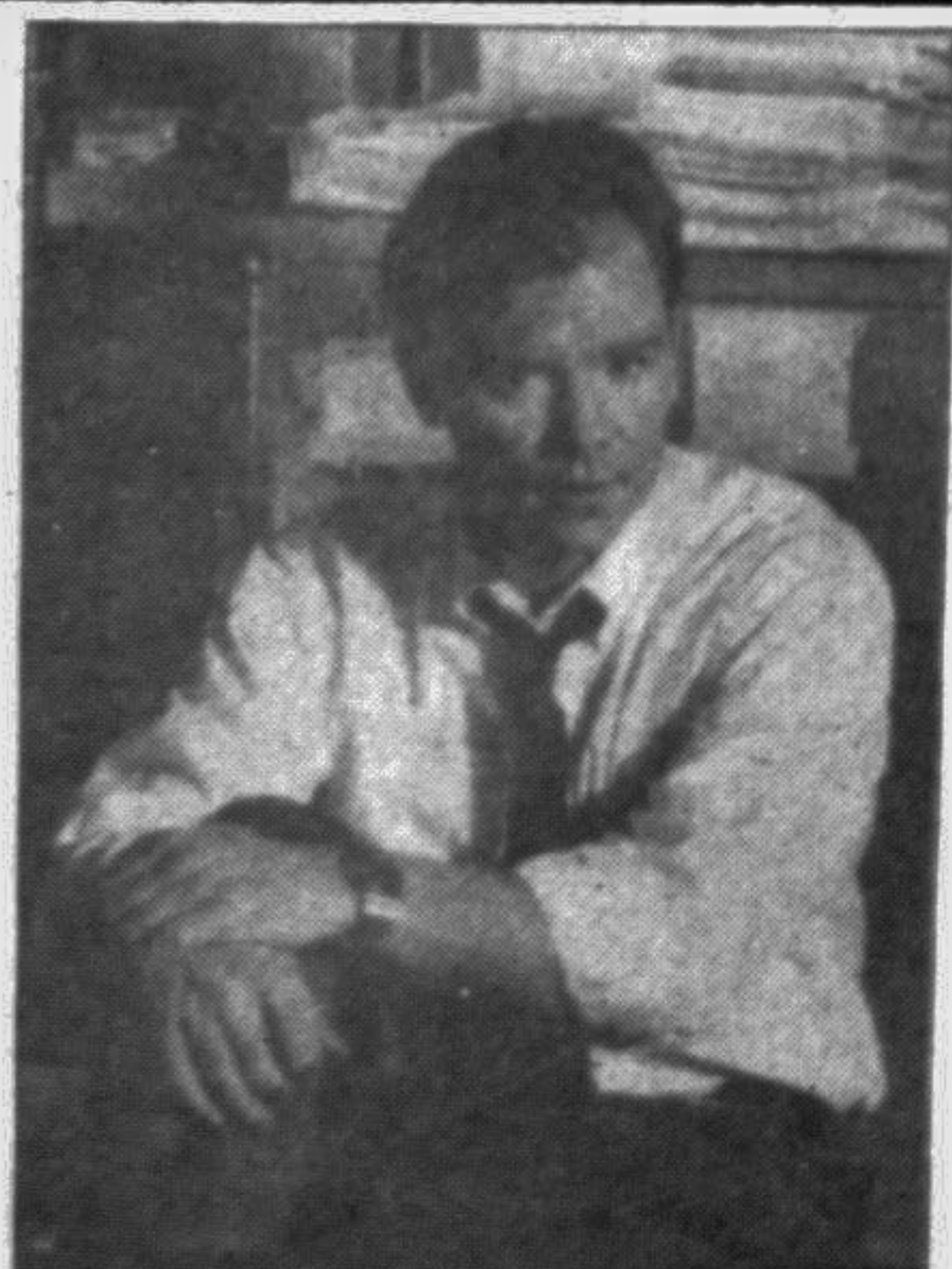

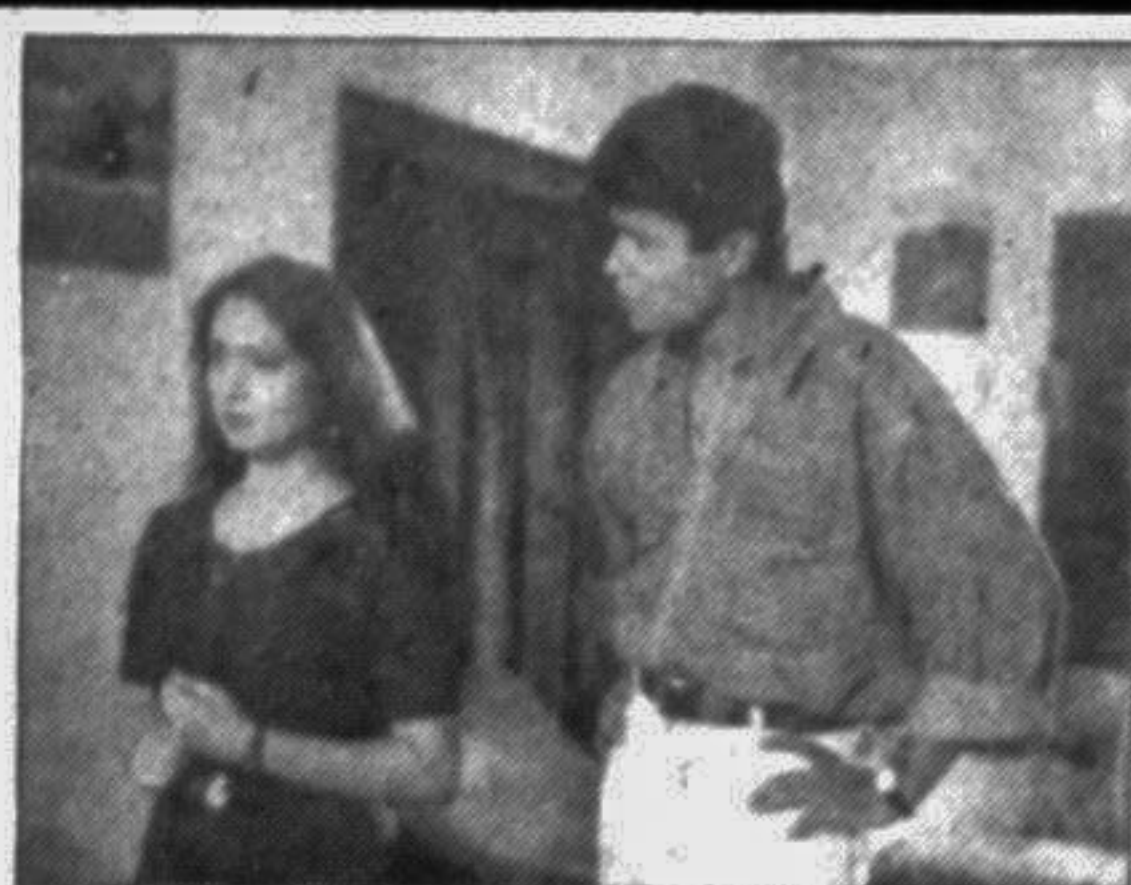
