Sheikh Hasina, leader of the Awami League Parliamentary Party (ALPP), was sworn-in as Prime Minister

yesterday. President Abdur Rahman Biswas administered the oath of office to the new prime minister at a solemn ceremony at the Darbar Hall of the Bangabhaban at 5-30

After swearing-in of the new prime minister, the President administered oath to eleven ministers and eight ministers of state at the largely attended function that coincided with the AL's 47th founding anniversary.

The ceremony began with playing of the national anthem, followed by recitation from the holy Quran.

The 48-year-old Hasina, wearing an off-white silk saree and a black headscarf solemnly recited the words of the oath of office and secrecy amid glare of flash lights and clicking of cameras.

Confident and lively Hasina then smiled at the audience at the packed Darbar Hall which bust into clapping and applause.

After the oath-taking, she exchanged pleasantries with

Talking briefly to journalists, she called for calm and restrain by all and sought cooperation of the opposition political parties for consolidation of democracy and wellbeing of the people.

Referring to BNP, the largest opposition in the Parliament, she said, "We two worked together in our long struggle for restoration of democracy and I hope if we work unitedly we will be able to lead the country to its desired goal."

Sheikh Hasina, daughter of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman who had led the country to independence, is the tenth prime minister and the second woman prime minister of Bangladesh.



"But our experiences show providing subsidies has a lot of problems because subsidies rarely reach the poor farmers. They are skimmed by the intermediaries to make high profits," he observed.

So subsidy is not a very effective way of helping the small or poor farmers, Landell-

gested "If you have choice in the money that you have got to help farmers. I would suggest to put that in improving seeds and improving roads and markets. And the best way of improving prices for farmers is to improve marketing facilities."

Mills maintained and sug-

A lot more is to be done to improve availability of seeds to the farmers, he said. "The seeds business should be opened up to the private sector. At the moment there are lots of restrictions on seeds distribution by private seed farms.

Questioning the quality of the past government's investment pattern, Landell-Mills said the Bank had identified a large number of projects which appear not to be well justified, and projects which may have been put in for political reasons.
