ELISTA, Russia, June 25: US challenger Gata Kamsky on Monday beat Russian titleholder Anatoly Karpov in the 10th game of the FIDE World Chess Championship being held in Elista (Kalmyk Republic), reports AFP.

Kamsky reduced the gap and Karpov is now leading by 6.5 points 3.5 points at midmatch. The young American resident, 22, complicated the middle-game with the white pieces to win this game in 59 moves.

The 11th of the 20 scheduled games will be played on Wednesday.

Maradona the master miser!

BUENOS AIRES. June 25: Six reporters who were shot and wounded with an air rifle by Argentine soccer star Diego Maradona in 1994, rejected his offer of a total of 10,000 dollars in compensation, La Prensa newspaper said on Monday, reports Reuter.

The reporters' lawyer, Marcelo Bermolen, said the offer was ridiculously small.

"This just shows Maradona not only shot the victims but on top of that he is making fun of them. The sum offered is laughable because it doesn't have any bearing on the damage caused. It doesn't cover the moral damage or economic costs, nor the costs of investigation, transport and commu-

nications," Bermolen said. Maradona's lawyers are asking that the former Argentina captain be put on probation for firing on journalists camped outside his mansion in February 1994. He was filmed on television crouching behind a Mercedes and aiming at the camera during the wild incident, which occurred after he was dismissed by local First Division team Newell's Old Boys after repeatedly failing to

turn up to practice. A state prosecutor requested that Maradona - currently playing for Boca Juniors - be jailed for four years.

FINA breaks Foschi's heart

LAUSANNE, Switzerland, June 25: American swimmer Jessica Foschi has had a twoyear drugs ban reimposed, the International swimming federation (FINA) said on Monday, reports Reuter.

Foschi tested positive for the anabolic steroid mesterolone metabolite at the US summer nationals in Pasadena.

Bird bids bye to cricket

LONDON, June 25: Dickie Bird, the world's best known cricket umpire, left the international arena on Monday with tears in his eyes at the end of the drawn Test between England and India at Lord's, reports Reuter.

The 63-year-old Bird, who began his 66-Test career in 1973, was given a police escort from the field as he made his way back to the pavilion with the giant screen at Lord's reading "Dickie Bird 66 retired"

"I'll never forget this last week as long as I live." Bird said afterwards.

"I'll miss the buzz of inter national cricket, the build-up to Tests, and being so involved. It's been my life.

Although the Test ended as a draw, bird was in the thick of it from the start on Thursday

when he gave England captain Mike Atherton out lbw to the fifth ball of the match.

On Monday, he gave his last decision at Test level when he sent back England saviour Jack Russell, Ibw to Saurav Ganguly for 38.

"I've had letters and telegrams from all over the world. want to thank everyone in Britain and around the world for their best wishes - and I mean that from the bottom of my heart." said Bird.

"The respect of all those people, and the receptions I've been given here in this match. that means more to me than any amount of money."

Bird will continue to umpire in county cricket until the end of next season.


Americans fear the worst

ATLANTA, Georgia, June 25: Sixty-one per cent of Americans fear a terrorist attack during the Olympic Games next month in Atlanta, according to a poll published here Monday, reports AFP.

The poll by Yankelovich partners for the Atlanta Journal Constitution newspaper found respondents particularly concerned in the wake of the 1993 World Trade Centre bombing in New York and the 1995 bombing of a federal building in Oklahoma city. Ok

India dominated the morning session and gave themselves a real chance of squaring the series as they took four wickets for just 57 runs to have England in trouble at 168 for six, a lead of just 81.

But the afternoon belonged to the English middle and late order as Irani and Rusell joined forces to frustrate the Indians with a stubborn seventh wicket partnership of 60.

Irani, playing in his second Test, made an accomplished 41 before playing on to Paras Mhambrey, but once he was gone Chris Lewis went into add 46 with Russell for the eighth wicket and, effectively. the match was saved.

We've had not more steel in our side over the last couple of years," England captain Mike Atherton said. "We had the worst of conditions to bat in at both the start and the end. I think it was a good effort to come out of it with a

draw. We stuck it out well, we are becoming more difficult to beat, and we are more competitive.

When Atherton declared on 278 for nine at 5.20 pm. stumps were drawn on the match and also on the 23-year international impairing career of Dickie Bird who left the field in tears at the end of his 66th and final Test match.

The Indians will rue the lost opportunity of forcing a win to level the series after England's success in the first Test at Edgbaston.

Atlanta Lin's swan-song

BEIJING, June 25: China's Lin Li, the world 200 metres individual medley record holder, will quit after next month's Atlanta Olympics, Xinhua news agency said today. reports Reuter.

"I have decided to retire after the Olympics," Xinhua quoted her as saying in training at the Yunnan provincial swimming pool in southwestern China.

Lin. 26, won an Olympic gold in the 200 event four years ago in Barcelona, and took a one-year break from competitive swimming after the Hiroshima Asian Games in 1994, where seven Chinese swimmers tested positive for performance-enhancing drugs.

She relaunched her swimming career at the start of the year, and at the Olympic trials in Tianjin in April finished second in the 200 metres breaststroke and the 200 metres individual medley.
