

AL secures 37.5 pc of votes cast, BNP 33.5 pc

Awami League (AL) secured 3.94 per cent more votes in the June 12 general elections than in the 1991 polls while BNP bagged 2.64 per cent more votes this time, according to official figures received from the Election Commission

Jatiya Party (JP) has also registered a rise by obtaining 4.21 per cent more votes compared to the 1991 elections while Jamaat-e-Islami's votes fell by 3.52 per cent.

In the June 12 general elections, a total of 424,23,180 votes were cast, of which 37.45 per cent 158.87.963 votes — were obtained by AL.

Of the total votes cast, BNP secured 33.45 per cent -141,92.078 votes — in the last parliamentary elections. While JP got 16.23 per cent of the votes cast with 68,83,285, and Jamaat 8.61 per cent with 36.53,012 votes In the 1991 general elec-

tions a total of 3.24,34,928 votes were cast, or which AL got 33.51 per cent, BNP 30.81 per cent, JP 11.92 per cent and Jamaat got 12.13 per cent of the votes cast In 1991, BNP was the only

party to have fielded candidates in all the 300 constituencies. AL then nominated 297 candidates in 300 seats while JP fielded 272 and Jamaat nominated 222 candi-

President, PM condole deaths of Americans

President Abdur Rahman Biswas and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, in separate messages to US President Bill Clinton yesterday, condoled the death of Americans in the bomb blast in Saudi Arabia, reports BSS.

President Biswas, in his message said, "We are extremely grieved to learn of the tragic loss of valuable lives of a number of US nationals and injuries to several hundreds of Saudi and foreign nationals including a large number of Bangladeshis due to the tragic bomb blast in the city of Khobar in Saudi Arabia. We strongly condemn this heinous act and express our deepest sympathies and condolences to your excellency and through you to the victims and their families.

Hasina Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in her message said. "I am deeply shocked to learn about the tragic bomb blast in the city of Khobar in Saudi Arabia killing scores of Americans and injuring several hundreds of Saudi and foreign national including a large number of Bangladeshis.

The government and the people of Bangladesh join mein strongly condemning and deploring this dastardly and cowardice act of terrorism.

By the judgement on the writ petition the HC declared the permanent transfers of some officer sand workers of Petro Bangla to the BAPEX Company, an affiliated company of the Petro Bangla, to be illegal, without lawful authority and were of no legal effect.

But the contemners, as alleged in the petition, did not comply with the judgement rather they introduced two separate gradation lists for the Petro Bangla and the BAPEX and awarded the officers of Petro Bangla with promotion who are junior to the petitioner.

Khandkar Mahbub Hossain. Senior Advocate assisted by Advocate Golam Kibria, Md Aizal Hossain Khurshida Bilkis Banu and Md Zafar Imam conducted the case of the petitioner.

In 1991, 424 independent candidates secured 14.97,396 votes - 4.39 per cent - while in the June 12 polls 281 independent candidates obtained 43.8.506 votes - a total of 1.03 per cent.

Islami Oikkya Jote secured 47.5.901 votes in the June 12 polls, which is 1.12 per cent of the total votes cast.

The remaining 76 parties which participated in the June 12 parliamentary elections together secured a total of 2.10 per cent of the votes cast with 892,435 votes.

10 injured in Rangamati clash

CHITTAGONG, June 27. At least 10 people were injured in a clash between the activists of Pahari Chhatra Parishad (PCP) and some non-tribal shopkeepers at around 10 am today at Baghaichhari under Rangamati district, police and local sources said.

The injured were admitted to the local health complex. The clash ensued when the non-tribal shopkeepers opened their shops ignoring the half-day hartal enforced in three hill districts jointly by PCP. Pahari Gano Parishad and the Hill Women Federation.

The hartal was called demanding the release of Kalpana Chakma, central organising secretary of Hill Women Federation (CWF) who was al legedly kidnapped from her house on the night of June il Irom Marissa under Bagharchhari thana of Rangamati hill district

A tense situation prevailed in CHT during hartal period today as the PCP activists also put up barricades on the roads there blocking traffic movement, witnesses said.

Three envoys meet Samad Azad

AFP says, the FBI is closely examining wreckage of the truck bomb in the search for clues as to who might have carried out the attack, a senior US official said today.

'Pieces of the truck remain,' said State Department spokesman Nicholas Burns in the aircraft carrying Secretary of State Warren Christopher from Dhahran where he spent two hours on Wednesday, to Lyon for the G7 summit opening today.

He said investigators would 'try to reconstruct the event very methodically."

By coincidence, a group of experts from the Federal Bureau of Investigation and State Department security was in Saudi Arabia when the Dhahran attack took place, Burns said.

Asked if the standing committee members, who lost in


the June 12 elections would be dropped, he said, "There is no reason to believe that anybody would be dropped for his defeat in the polls."
