In its outlook for subsequent two days Met Office predicted little change. Given its extended outlook for another five days weathermen forecast increase in rainfall activities.


Country's highest temperature 33.1 degree Celsius was recorded at Rangamati and the lowest 23.7 degrees at Kutubdia yesterday.

Call for creating awareness about AIDS prevention

A day-long orientation programme on prevention of AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome), held under the auspices of the Society for the Care and Education of Mentally Retarded, Bangladesh (SCEMRB) in cooperation with Voluntary Health Services Society (VHSS), emphasised the importance of creating mass consciousness about AIDS and its mortal danger, report BSS.
