5000 more HSC examinees expelled

5 magistrates assaulted, over 100 hurt in clashes

At least 112 people including five magistrates and an invigilator were injured in clashes and over 5000 examinees were expelled under five education boards of the country on the second day yesterday of the HSC examinations. Fifty people were injured in

Cox's Bazar. 30 in Chandpur, five in Mymensingh and 27 in Faridpur. According to official sour-

ces, the board-wise break up of the expelled examinees is: 1723 in Dhaka Board, 2476 in Rajshahi Board, 689 in Jessore Board, 503 in Comilla Board and 176 in Chittagong Board.

An invigilator was expelled from a centre in Pabna under Rajshahi Board, the Board sources said Our Cox's Bazar Correspon-

dent writes: At least fifty people, including magistrate, were injured in a clash between some HSC candidates backed by outsiders and the police in two examination centres of the district.

In Moheshkhali college, a magistrate expelled one student for adopting unfair means in the English second paper examination, police said.

At this, some outsiders and other HSC candidates became angry. The outsiders entered the examination hall and

started throwing stones in
