For some years now a particular news in the paper invokes a caustic distaste in my mouth whenever I come across it. And I come across it often enough as do almost all of Dhaka's newspaper reading populace. Picture this: a smiling face (any face aged between forty and four, but always female) peering out from behind a droopy, indistinguishable but never-the-less white flower on a blurred potted plant (as seen in news print). Sound familiar? Of course. like the solar eclipse or Haley's comet, the blossoming of the Night Queen is made out to be a rare occurrence worthy of having one's boxed picture published on newspapers across

the country if one is fortunate enough to experience or witness it first hand! A flower, so divine that it blooms only once in a hundred years (it started out with this myth) or once every year (this is the most recent corollary of the initial myth). Gonoshahajjo Sangstha seminar

A two-day annual seminar organised by Association for Legal Aid and Legal Education of Gonoshahajjo Sangstha begins at the Planning and Development Academy in the city today, reports UNB.

Chairman of the Department of Government and Politics, Jahangirnagar University, Dr Dilara Chowdhury will present a paper on "democracy, state, government and political party" at the first session of the seminar.

Dr F R Mahmud Hassan will present a paper on "code of conduct of the political parties and responsibilities to the society", says a press release.

Prof Anisur Rahman, Barrister Shaukat Ali Khan, Barrister Amir-ul-Islam, Prof Anisuzzaman, Advocate Khandker Mahbubuddin Ahmed and Suranjit Sen Gupta will participate in the seminar.

Malaysian govt urged to review laws on migrant workers

Naripakkha, a women's organisation, described as "inhuman" the condition of migrant workers in Malaysia and demanded both Bangladesh and Malaysian governments ensure their basic human

rights, reports UNB. Addressing a press conference at the Jatiya Press Club, its leaders demanded that the Malaysian government review laws and procedures relating to migrant workers, particularly in detention camps, to ensure internationally recognised human rights.

Some three lakh Bangladeshi workers, 10 per cent of them females, are now working in Malaysia. More than 70,000 Bangladeshi workers are staying there illegally. many of them languishing at different detention camps. said a Naripakkha report.

The workers go to Malaysia with temporary jobs and after some time, they become illegal after losing their jobs and are forced to go into police custody or detention camps, the report said.

In the detention camps, it said, 400 people were kept in one place with only one bath-room. They received only two small glasses of water a day and did not get any treatment during illnesses and were tortured on various pretext.

"Many Bangladeshi workers died in the detention camps of various diseases and of torture," the report claimed, demanding enforcement of human rights for the detainces and migrant workers.

The Naripakkha leaders also protested the arrest of Irene Fernandez, director of Tenaganita, a Malaysian human rights group, by the Malaysian government on charge of false

Tenaganita (Women Force) deals with women's issues, such as rape, sexual assault, domestic violence, including problems pertaining to plantation workers, sex workers and migrant workers.

Irene published a report on "Abuse, Torture and Dehumanised Treatment of Migrant Workers in Detention Camps" in August 1995, based on testimonials given by 350 Filipino, Indonesian and Bangladeshi detainees from various camps.

The press conference was addressed, among others, by Naripakkha convenor Perween 'Hasan and member Raushan Ara Bibi. Some migrant workers who returned from Malaysia narrated their experience at the press conference.

3 arms recovered, 237 held in city

Police recovered three illegal fire arms and arrested six persons for possession from different areas of the city yesterday, reports UNB.

The recovered arms included one foreign-made sawn-off rifle, one revolver and one pistol, said a DMP press

Police also arrested 237 people from various parts of the city in the past 24 hours.



Stolen car recovered


