JU rally to demand ouster of 26 Shibir activists

Thousands of students of Jahangirnagar University (JU) brought out a procession and held a rally on the campus yesterday demanding the expulsion of 26 students for alleged terrorist activities on the campus.

The students also demanded action against six JU teachers who reportedly had links with the Islamic Chhatra Shibir (ICS) and had helped them in recent terrorist activities on the campus.

The 26 JU students, belonging to the ICS, were arrested July 1 following an abortive ICS bid to capture certain dormitories on the campus.

The procession, starting from the central cafeteria, paraded through the campus and it was followed by a rally in front of the vice-chancellor's (VC) office at around 11:30 am. Arriving at the rally, the JU VC, Prof. Amirul Islam Chowdhury told the students that ac-

tion would be taken against the terrorists as per the provisions in the proctorial rules of the university.

Showcase notices have been served to the students responsible for terrorism, and they will be informed of further action on July 22 the last day for filing answers to the show cause notices," the VC told the students.

Later, the APSU leader declared a three-hour token strike, to be observed July 11, to press home their demands.

Plan Int'l team calls on Biswas

A three-member delegation of Plan International Bangladesh, a non-governmental organisation, led by Max Van Der Schalk, international executive director of the organisation, called on President Abdur Rahman Biswas at Bangabhaban yesterday, reports BSS.

The leader of the team apprised the president of their integrated child welfare and development activities in 41 countries all over the world for the benefit of approximately 8 million vulnerable children and their families. In Bangladesh, plan international has a three-year budget for more than Tk 30 crore approved by the NGO bureau of the government for children's welfare activities, he added.

Talking to them, President Biswas expressed his satisfaction to learn about their child welfare-oriented activities. He said children are the future guardians of this planet and added that through proper planning and concerted efforts, the children are to be helped for their proper physical and mental growth by providing them with education, nutrition and other welfare measures.

The other two members were Dr Hans J Hoyer, regional director of South Asia and Subhadra Belbase, country director of Plan International Bangladesh.

JCD demands resignation of home minister

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal yesterday demanded resignation of the Home Minister, Rafiqul Islam, for his failure to curb terrorism, a priority task of the Awami-League government, reports UNB.

JCD, the student front of BNP, made the demand from a rally it organised at the Aparajyo Bangla on the Dhaka University campus to protest the Home Minister's "step-brotherly" attitude towards JCD men.

The JCD leaders at the rally criticised the minister for not receiving their memorandum. They went to submit the memorandum to him on Sunday.

day in protest against what they said terrorist activities unleashed by Chhatra League, the student wing of ruling Awami League.

"It was out scheduled programme... when we reached the office, we were asked to wait as the minister was busy... but after two hours, we were told that the minister is out," said JCD president Fazlul Haq Milon.

He alleged that the minister did not take the memorandum as Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina directed him to refuse it.

He also criticised the government for arresting the JCD workers on various "false" charges and demanded immediate release of their activists. The rally was addressed, among others, by Nasiruddin Pintu and Shahiduddin Chowdhury Ani.

Bar Council oral exam Aug 16

The next viva-voce examination for enrollment of the advocates of Bangladesh Bar Council will begin on August 16, a press release of the council said yesterday, reports BSS.

It said those candidates who could not come out successful in the last viva-voce examination would be able to submit their applications to the Bar Council by July 31.

Decision to revamp Anti-Corruption Bureau hailed

Bangladesh Civil Service (BCS) Central Sangram Parishad hailed the government steps of reorganising the Bureau of Anti-Corruption, reports BSS.

The prokrichi-BCS Sangram Parishad, in a meeting Sunday presided over by acting chairman of the organisation MAK Azad at the headquarters at IEB, recommended to make the Bureau of Anti-Corruption a constitutional body so that the Bureau will be able to work freely and neutrally like the Public Service Commission and the Election Commission.

This will pave the way to make the administration clean and transparent.

ROK envoy assures continued aid in health sector

South Korean Ambassador to Bangladesh Jong Kyoo Byun yesterday assured that his country would continue to provide assistance in the development of health sector of Bangladesh, reports UNB.

The assurance was given when the Ambassador called on Health and Family Welfare Minister Saleh Uddin Yusuf at his secretariat office yesterday.

During the meeting they discussed matters relating to the Korean assistance in this sector and Bangladesh-Korean Friendship Hospital, which will be established in Savar.

BGMEA urges govt to ensure safety of businessmen

The Bangladesh Garment Manufacturers and Exporters Association (BGMEA) yesterday demanded immediate arrest and exemplary punishment of all criminals involved in Sunday's dacoity in Mirpur, reports UNB.

In a statement, BGMEA President Redwan Ahmed expressed deep concern at the dacoity committed at broad daylight. He, however, appreciated the law enforcing agencies for promptly arresting some of the miscreants with part of the looted money.

The BGMEA president requested the authorities concerned to take effective measures to provide safety for businessmen.

An amount of Tk 25 lakh in cash was looted at gun-point from some staff of a sweater factory at Sheorapara in Mirpur thana on Sunday afternoon. Police arrested six members of the gang and recovered Tk 4,54,000 within an hour of the incident.

Obituary

Ganesh C Saha, a senior civil engineer of the country, breathed his last in the early hours yesterday in a Calcutta clinic following a by-pass operation, family sources said. He was 53, reports BSS.

A graduate of Ahsanullah Engineering College, Ganesh Saha served with various private firms in different capacities over the past three decades. He was the chief engineer of Beximco Engineering Limited until his death.

Saha, who suffered a stroke three months ago, went to Calcutta only a week ago for the operation, which was done Sunday.

His body will be flown in from Calcutta today. He will be cremated at Lakhsham tomorrow, sources said.

Eid-e-Miladunnabi programme

The government has chalked out an elaborate programme to celebrate Eid-e-Miladunnabi with due solemnity and religious fervour, reports UNB.

Seeratunnabi, marking the birth and death anniversary of Prophet Hazrat Muhammad (SM), will take place at the end of July subject to moon-sighting by the National Moon Sighting Committee.

The President and the Prime Minister will give messages to the nation on the holy occasion.

An interministerial meeting presided over by State Minister for Religious Affairs Moulana Mohammad Nurul Islam, held at the conference room of the Ministry of Religious Affairs yesterday, chalked out the programmes.

The meeting decided that on the day, national flags would be hoisted at all public and private buildings.

National flags and bunting inscribed with "Kalema Taieba" both in Bangla and Arabic, will be hoisted along thoroughfares, lightposts and traffic islands.

Decision has also been taken to observe Eid-e-Miladunnabi at Bangladesh Secretariat, with the President as chief guest.

Bangladesh Television and Bangladesh Betar will broadcast special programmes and newspapers will publish special supplements on Eid-e-Miladunnabi.

Islamic Foundation and Islamic cultural centres in different districts will arrange seminars and discussion meetings highlighting the life and works of Hazrat Mohammad (SM).

Similarly, district administrations, upazila administrations, Waqf, Bangla Academy, universities, educational and

cultural institutions will arrange Seerat Mahfil and discussion on the life and ideals of Hazrat Mohammad (SM).

Children's programmes will be organised by the Shishu Academy, Dhaka. Bangladesh missions abroad will also arrange Seerat Mahfil.

Special diets will be served to patients in hospitals, inmates of jails and children centre, baby homes, vagrant welfare centres and destitute welfare centres.

Arrangements will also be made to keep cities and towns neat and clean by city corporations and pourashavas.

Among others, Secretary of the Ministry of Religious Affairs Abdul Hannan was present at the meeting.

Telephone exchange at Char Alekjaner opens today

Shipping Minister ASM Abdur Rab will inaugurate a 100-line micro-wave telephone exchange at Char Alekjaner under Lakkhipur district today, reports BSS.

According to a press release of Bangladesh Telegraph and Telephone Board, Char Alekjaner was brought under the NWD (direct dialling) system earlier.

The NWD code number of Char Alekjaner is 03823. Meanwhile one hundred and fifty telephone lines which had become unworkable during the digging of roads by A-catel four days ago, were restored Sunday.

Besides, 300 telephone lines at Mohammadpur which also had become unworkable when the cables were stolen, were also restored, according to a press release of the T and T Board.

Thundershower likely

Light to moderate rain or thundershower accompanied by temporary gusty wind is likely at many places over Barisal, Chittagong, Sylhet divisions and at a few places over Khulna, Dhaka, Rajshahi divisions in the next 12 hours till 6 pm today, reports UNB.

Day temperature may rise by 1 to 2 degree Celsius across the country, the Met Office said.

In its outlook for subsequent two days Met Office forecast increase in rainfall activity. Giving extended outlook for another five days, weathermen predicted little change.

Meantime, Sylhet experienced the highest 44 mm rain during the last 36 hours till 6 pm yesterday. Ishurdi had 24 mm rain, Khulna 20, Barisal 6 and Dinajpur 5 mm shower in the period.

Country's highest temperature 33.6 degree Celsius was recorded at Jessore yesterday and the lowest 22.5 degrees at Kutubdia.
