In a resolution, the meeting demanded of the governments of Bangladesh and Pakistan to announce before August 14 the schedule of repatriation of the stranded Pakistanis, said a press release.

The meeting also resolved to observe an 8-hour hunger strike from 9 am on August 4 in front of the Jatiya Press Club in Dhaka to attract world attention to 'rightful claim' of the stranded Pakistanis to be repatriated to Pakistan.

### NGOs poverty alleviation activities lauded

Two foreign teams from Afghanistan and Tajikistan, during an exposure visit to Bangladesh which ended yesterday, were impressed to see the NGO activities in alleviating poverty in the country.

Members of the Coordination of Humanitarian Assistance (CHA) of Afghanistan and Pamir Relief Development Program (PRDP) of Tajikistan visited Bangladesh from June 24 to July 9 with an aim to exchanging development experiences of Bangladesh, NGOs, specially in the field of rural development.

Nova Consultancy Bangladesh (NCB), the consultancy office for Novib, a Dutch donor agency, in Bangladesh, in collaboration with BRAC and Proshika organised the programme to share NGO experiences of Bangladesh, said a press release of NCB yesterday.

The visit by the six-member team of PRDP and five-member team of CHA was mainly concentrated on BRAC and Proshika, the press release added, saying that the teams also visited ADAB, Uddipan, SARPV and UCEP.

## DCC directive against road digging in rainy season

The Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) has warned different services of stern action if they further dig up city roads in the prevailing rainy season, DCC sources said.

'We have asked different services, particularly the T&T, to refrain from further digging of city roads during the rainy season. If they do not abide by the instruction, we will take legal action' said a highly placed official of the DCC, adding that only in cases of 'absolute urgency' digging may be done.

A total 318 kilometres of roads have been dug up in the city over the last few months and most of them remain unrepaired, even after months of completion of work, DCC officials said.

About 80 per cent of the digging has been done by the T&T under a French aid programme to install 8,000 digital telephone lines, DCC sources said, showing documents. The remaining digging of the city roads was done by WASA and DESA.

Initially, when the T&T approached the DCC to seek permission to dig up the roads, it was understood that the repair work to the roads should be finished within 'a day or two' after the work was done, an official said, alleging that months passed by, yet the DCC did not get any clearance from the firm to do repairs.

As per procedure, whenever an organisation seeks permission to dig a road, it is required to pay for the repair work in advance. But the re-

pair work cannot be carried out by the DCC until it is given clearance by the firm.

'In the case of T&T, they are now saying that clearance for the repair work cannot be given because they need to test the installed integrated network after completion of the project,' the DCC official said requesting anonymity.

It was learnt that the firm was now seeking permission to dig up roads in the city's Rayer Bazar, Dhanmondi, Kawranbazar, Ulan Maradia, Razarbagh, Lalbagh, Siddeswari and part of Moghbazar areas.

'We cannot permit anyone to dig up roads in the rainy season unless it is an emergency,' said the official, adding that the T&T was in a hurry to finish the job for they had a project deadline to meet.

I am sorry to say that they did not take the rainy season,

into consideration while planning the work,' alleged the DCC official, explaining how extensive digging makes life unbearable on the city streets in the rainy season, causing congestion and accidents.

'We are appealing to the authorities to extend the time of the T&T project and complete the work in the dry season,' he said.

When contacted, the project director of T&T declined to comment on the matter.

To repair a square metre of brick pavement the cost stands at Tk 287, for one square metre of bitumin carpeted road with three inch grouting and one and half inch carpeting, the cost comes to Tk 436 while repair of per cubic meter of concrete road costs Tk 3033, according to DCC record.

### Removal of Mujib's portrait Sanskritik Oikhya Jote rally today

Joy Bangla Sanskritik Oikhya Jote, a combination of 45 cultural organisations, will hold a rally in front of the Jatiya Press Club in the city this afternoon to protest the removal of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib's portrait from the cabinet room of the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban recently, says a press release.

Prominent artists, intellectuals, freedom fighters, ministers and state ministers will be present at the rally, at 4 pm, the release said.

Meanwhile, the Bangabandhu Prokoushal Parishad in a statement called for forming social resistance against the people responsible for such arrogance against the spirit of independence war.

BSS adds: A meeting of the Combined Professional Action Council, held in Chittagong Monday strongly condemned and protested the removal of the portrait of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman from the cabinet room of the Jatiya Sangsad.

The meeting, presided over by convenor of the council, Prof Abdul Mannan, was addressed by council members Advocate Ibrahim Hossain Babul, Prof Anwarul Azim, Advocate Iftekher Saimun Chowdhury, Engineer Rashid Chowdhury, Dr A Q M Serajul Islam Chowdhury, journalists Akhterun-Nabi, Anjan Kumar Sen and Helaluddin Chowdhury, a council press release said.

They termed the incident as an insolent behaviour of certain persons. The incident was not only indecorous but also contradictory to democratic culture, they said.

The leaders demanded the arrest and trial of those responsible for removing the portrait of Bangabandhu.

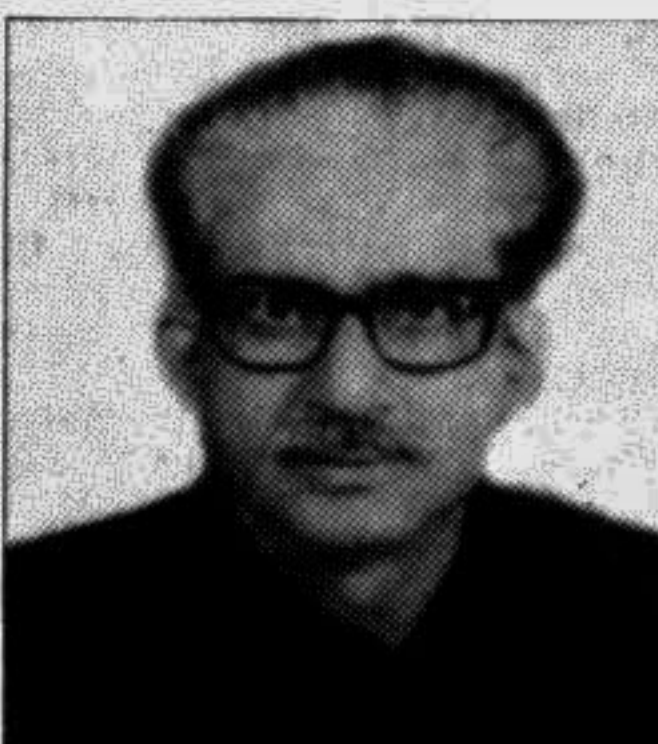
### Obituary

### Death anniversary

The 5th death anniversary of Advocate Shamsuddin Mollah, an organiser of the War of Liberation and one of the formulators of the Constitution, will be observed befittingly in Faridpur today, reports BSS.
