Kadam's Special Appeal

The botanical name for Kadam Phool doesn't matter much as a liking for the flower is perhaps ingrained in Bengalee psyche, which finds eloquent expression particularly in the rainy season.

The refrain of the Tagore song 'Badal diner pratham Kadam Phool' (the first Kadam Phool of the rainy season) enjoys immense popularity among those who like Tagore songs. The onset of the monsoon reminds those of us who harbour romantic feelings of the lush blooming of Kadam Phool.

The reason for the scarcity of Kadam trees in Dhaka city is understandable. Yet, quite a few of them are here and there to provide our eyes and minds with a feast of colour and beauty. There may be isolated existence of some of them at the Balda Gardens, Mirpur Botanical garden and the Rajendrapur Botanical garden. But it seems to be a matter for concern that Kadam tree seems to have been caught up in the process of extinction as a botanical species in our country where it enjoys universal popularity.

Kadam's mythical association dates back to the days of Lord Krishna. Radha and Krishna had in most part their leela (romance on a higher plane) enacted under Kadam trees. Not surprisingly both Tagore and Nazrul suggest to hang a jhulana (traditional swing) from a Kadam tree. But only a foot will swing from the softest of trees. In our city life, we now notice a growing interest in flowers for various occasions. That is why we see a proliferation of flower shops all over the city. Even on footpaths and road crossings, we find a host of flower vendors. But it strikes me that among the many kinds of flowers sold, mainly *rajnandha*, there is a conspicuous absence of *Kadam Phools*. The reason seems to be obvious: there isn't enough supply of that kind of flowers and perhaps the new generation who are

the largest customers of these flowers are oblivious of the charm of Kadam Phool. The Kadam Phool has a charm of its own, with a light yellow outer cover with a thick layer of soft and short bristles, white in colour. Its round shape with such colour combination imparts to it a kind of exotic beauty, adding to the tremendous variety of attractive native flowers.

A friend once commented that roses have their distinct place in the world of flowers, but how many of us can really appreciate the beauty of a Kadam Phool. In the cycle of seasons, there will be rainy seasons but the way Kadam trees are getting lost in the denudation process all over the country, a time may come when a Kadam Phool will be an object of preservation in some select areas. One reason why, as some suggested, the tree is losing popularity as a source of income is that its wood structure is so brittle that it is incapable of being used for purposes of furniture, except for purposes of fuel and match stick making in factories.

The lyric of the Tagore song will remain and with it our acquaintance with this kind of flower during the rainy season. The romantic among us will continue to seek it as a memento of love and respect for the adorable. But there is no doubt that the tropical flower stands for an aspect of our own culture untrammelled by any foreign influence. It is not known if there is Kadam Phool in similar tropical environment elsewhere and whether it enjoys the same kind of liking as felt by our people. Our love for it as expressed in the popular Tagore song will be a source of eternal joy, irrespective of whether the Kadam tree will become an extinct botanical species in the days to come.

Role of DMC in advancing medicare lauded

Token strike in JU today

The All Party Students' Unity (APSU) of the Jahangirnagar University (JU) has called a two-hour token strike from 10 am today demanding the expulsion of 26 activists of Islamic Chhatra Shibir (ICS) for their terrorist activities on the campus.

The APSU will also stage a sit-in in front of the Vice Chancellor's (VC) office July 15 to press home the demand.

The 26 ICS activists were arrested from campus July 1 following an abortive ICS bid to capture one of the dormitories of the university.

Meanwhile, the authorities have served showcause notices to all the 26 students, now in Dhaka Central Jail, asking for reply by July 21.

'Govt to initiate liberal policies to attract FDI'

Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman said in the city yesterday that the government would initiate more liberal and realistic steps to attract Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in the country, reports BSS.
