2 die in Khulna Govt poultry farm in Gopalganj facing manifold problems

GOPALGANJ, July 10: The only government run poultry farm, located in the outskirts of the district headquarters. has been facing manifold problems.

According to the sources the varieties of poultry birds available here are white Leghorn of Italy, Fumy of Pakistan, Lowman Brown of Germany. Rhode Island Red (HIR) of England, Khaki Cambell of England, Indian Runner, Muscovy of USA and Jing Ding of China. Under the guidance of the government farm, eight private poultry have been set up in the district - three in Gopalganj Sadar thana, two in Tungipara Thana and one each in Muksudpur, Kasiani and Kowtalipara thanas.

When visited five of the eight private farms in the district, it is observed that Lowmen Brown, Rhode Island Red, Indian Runner and Khaki Camell varieties have much demand and these are soldat the rates, what seems to be costly for the poor people. As there is no private farm selling developed varieties of hens and ducks, the interested people are to purchase them from the government farm at the higher rates. An official told this correspondent that as there is no scope of hatching by incubators here, the government farm has to bring the poultry birds from outside the district and to sell them at the higher rates.


