Romantsev resigns

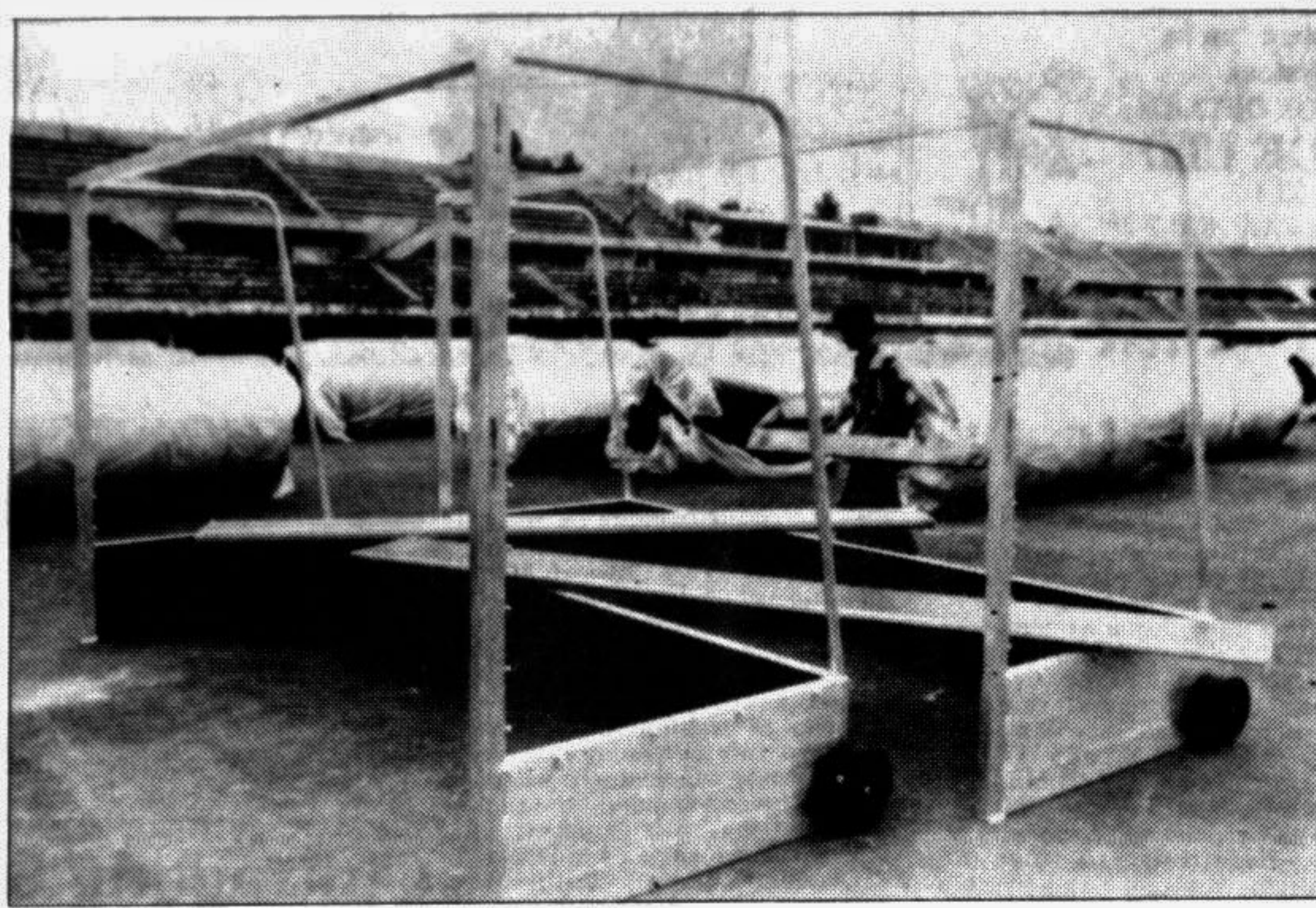

NEWPORT, Rhode Island, July 11: Top seed Byron Black of Zimbabwe survived his second consecutive three-set battle by holding off South African qualifier Robbie Koenig, 6-3, 5-7, 6-2 on Wednesday to advance to the quarter finals of the 230,000 dollars Hall of Fame tennis tournament, reports Reuter.

Black, ranked 29th in the world, did not face a break point while breaking Koenig twice in the final set of the one hour, 42 minute match. But seeds continued to fall at the only grass court tournament on the ATP Tour in the United States.

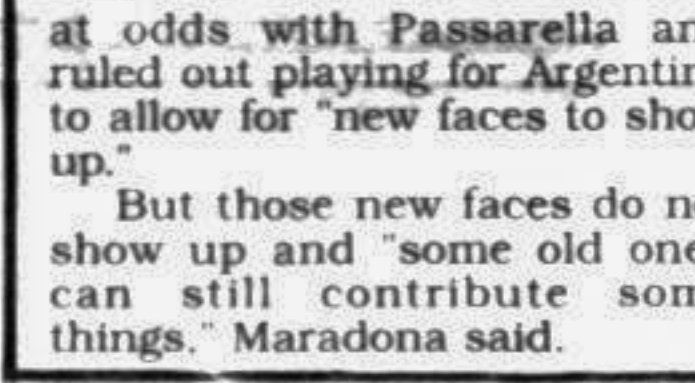

Hagi ordered to pay up

BUCHAREST, July 11: Barcelona midfielder and Romanian national team captain Georgehe "Gica" Hagi has been ordered to pay his former wife a divorce settlement equal to 338,000 dollars, newspapers reported on Thursday, reports AP.

His former wife also has the right to half his 10-room villa in Bucharest, a court in the Transylvanian city of Brasov ruled on Wednesday. Reports said the court ruled that Hagi did not have to pay monthly alimony of 7,000 dollars. His former wife Celinca was ordered to pay 20 million lei (6,560 dollars) in court costs.

The average monthly salary in Romania is about 294,000 lei, about 90 dollars. Hagi, 32, led Romania to the quarterfinals at the 1994 World Cup, but this year couldn't help it to get out of the first round at the European Championship. Hagi and Celinca were married in 1993 and split shortly afterward. He remarried in 1995.

Umpiring peeves Azhar



LONDON, July 11: India cricket captain Mohammed Azharuddin has called on the International Cricket Council to investigate the declining standard of Umpiring in Test cricket, reports agencies.

In the wake of India's 1-0 series defeat by England — and a number of poor decisions by the ICC-appointed umpires Darrell Hair of Australia and K T Francis of Sri Lanka — Azharuddin said Wednesday that the ICC should sort out umpiring in Test cricket. "I feel it is up to the ICC," he said. "We are not very professional in cricket, not as much as they are in other sports. The game has changed so much and one decision can make so much difference."

The ICC took the decision to allow all nine Test-playing countries to nominate two umpires for the international panel, while England was the only country with full-time professionals, is eligible to nominate four. Azharuddin's criticism will not have been doused by an appalling — albeit inconsequential — action by Francis on the last day of the third Test at Trent Bridge.

'Super Eights' joins cricket fraternity today

SYDNEY, July 11: Australia will launch an ambitious campaign on Friday to establish cricket as a major sport in Asia but the new eight-a-side format will bear little resemblance to the traditional game, reports Reuter.

Australian Cricket Board (ACB) officials have made drastic rule changes for the inaugural Super Eights tournament to be staged in Kuala Lumpur from Friday and featuring some of the game's top players from the leading cricketing nations. Super Eight matches will last about two hours with each side facing a maximum of 14 overs, placing the onus firmly on the batsmen to score runs as quickly as possible.

The emphasis will be on fast, furious action and fun while keeping the fundamental nature of the game intact," said ACB marketing manager David Fouy. "We are looking to expand further and we are evaluating other Asian cities to host future tournament," Fouy told Reuters.

In devising the new rules, the ACB has accepted the need for a more frenetic version of cricket to appeal to an audience unfamiliar with the intricacies of one-day or five-day Test cricket. "It makes sense to introduce the basics of what cricket is about in this form rather than introduce the complexities of 11-a-side Test-cricket. That would be a very big challenge to market in Asia," he said.

"Our feeling from Asia is that they are really excited by a bat-on-ball game which lasts for two hours," Fouy was quoted as saying in Friday's Sydney Morning Herald newspaper. Fouy said the ruling body had invested a significant sum in staging and promoting the three-day tournament in Malaysia but declined to give further detail.

In Super Eights, shots which clear the boundary will be worth eight runs instead of the traditional six while each player, except the wicket-keeper, must bowl at least one over. A batsman must also retire if he scores 50 runs but he can

return to the crease if all the other batsmen have been dismissed. Australia will field its two strongest teams for the tournament, which also features a Malaysian invitational side, led by former Australia captain Allan Border, India, New Zealand and South Africa.

Australia captain Mark Taylor has predicted that batsmen will need to score between 12 and 18 runs per six-ball over to win matches. "Everyone is going to try and get out there and Whack 50 runs as quick as they can," Taylor told reporters before leaving for Malaysia on Tuesday.

"Some blokes will try and belt it over the fence every ball and hit eights, as they call them, but if you can average two for three runs a ball, you'll be pretty successful."

Taylor said he believed the new format could develop alongside the existing forms of limited overs and Test cricket. Super Eight matches will be screened on pay television in Australia and Asia, the ACB said.

India gunning for gold

ATLANTA, July 11 (AFP): Eight-time Olympic champions India hope to climax a remarkable comeback to the top of international field hockey with a gold medal in Atlanta.

A triumph at the Olympic Games would end a 16-year drought for a nation that was once the dominant international force in the sport. But India will have stiff competition. Holland and Australia are the favourites to win semifinal places, closely followed by South Korea. Olympic champions Germany are clear favourites to win the other group, with Pakistan and India battling to join them in the semifinals.

The Indians, who last won an Olympic gold at the western boycotted Moscow Games in 1980, slipped to a humiliating low in 1986 when they finished 12th out of 12 contenders in the World Cup. But wily coach Cedric D'Souza, backed by a committed administration under police chief K P S Gill, have transformed the ragtag hockey outfit into world-beaters again.

The rejuvenated Indians carry the entire nation's hopes of Olympic glory after victories over gold medalists Germany, world champions Pakistan and powerful Holland over the past 12 months. This team knows they are capable of winning the gold.
