# Economists urge govt to be rational on agri subsidy

Country's leading economists advised the government to be rational at the maximum in deciding subsidy on agriculture input so that public money is not misspent, reports UNB.

During a pre-budget consultation with Finance Minister S A M S Kibria in the NEC conference room yesterday, they cautioned the government against risks of wastage and misuse of subsidy. Economists insisted subsidy should not be indiscriminate, rather be targeted and well thought out.

Meeting sources said that Abu Abdullah, Director General of Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS), particularly cautioned against any fresh subsidy on fertiliser.

Kibria, in response, told the economists that the government was still examining best options in subsidising the agri-

Explaining the system, another source said that the cover sheet of an answer script is passed through a scanner. which reads the code given in it and then the number is sent to the computer. These imported cover

sheets have a special code known as "litho code" and it cannot be manipulated, he said. The scanner "identifies the script through that number only" and rejects the cover sheets which are tampered or have some faulty code number. he added.
