

President-elect Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed has said he will try to maintain neutrality of the office of the Head of

State. will try to maintain neutrality of the office of the President," Justice Shahabuddin said while talking to newsmen at his Dhanmandi residence yesterday hours after the Election Commission declared him elected unopposed President of the coun-

He, however, refused to say anything about the policies of the government saying, "Still there are two months fifteen days to go for my swearing in to the office."

The Election Commission through a gazette notification vesterday announced that Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed had been elected unopposed President of the country according to Article 7 of the Presidential Election Act, 1991 and subclause 6 of clause 12 of the Presidential Election Regulation, 1991.

The ruling Awami League had nominated him as its candidate for the presidency with no other contestant from the

Opposition. Justice Shahabuddin will replace President Abdur Rahman Biswas whose tenure expires on October 8.

A former Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed had also headed the caretaker government which conducted the 1991 general elections. The 1991 election was acclaimed nationally and internationally as a free and fair one.

"There was no precondition from any quarter," Justice Shahabuddin said about his nomination for the post of presidency. He, however, said that he would have been more happy if his nomination papers were signed by both the major parties in the country

Justice Shahabuddin said that he accepted the offer of the ruling party for the sake of upholding the democratic system. "In the parliamentary system there has to be a President. Otherwise, it ceases to exist.

No computer error: Chairman

DB to review results of 908 candidates

The Dhaka Education Board will soon set new rules for the computerised evaluation system to minimise confusion and errors by SSC and HSC candidates. Chairman of the board Moyez Uddin Ahmed said yes-

He said at a press conference in the city that due to candidates' errors in filling the code of questionnaire set in the answer scripts, results of 2785 SSC candidates in the Dhaka Board were "affected" Of them, 908 candidates were declared unsuccessful exclusively for not writing the set codes.

The Chairman said, as per the Prime Minister's instruc tion, the board will review the results of these 908 candidates under the Dhaka Board. Results of such other candidates under four other boards may

also be reviewed, he said. "If the problem of the set code is solved. 42 of these 908 candidates may get star marks. 342 first division, 510 second division and 14 third division. he added.

The situation in Bogra. Sherpur, Sirajganj, Jamalpur and Tangail districts remained static but showing an improving trend as water levels of the rivers of these districts mar

ked fall in upstream points. Four people, including two children, drowned in the flood water at different places of Sirajganj district in the last 24

The victims are: Asad Ali 45 of Chhatiantoli in Sadar thana, Abdul Matin, 65, of Dar gapara in Shahjadpur. Kho deza. 8, of Taltola in the same thana, and Hatem, 5, of Naggati village in Belkuchi thana. Part of the district town of Madaripur went under water

lakh people of the district in abject misery Shantinagar, Amirabad, Kalatala, Sabujbag and BSCIC areas in the district headquarters were flooded as the rivers maintained steady rise with downrush of water from up2.25 lakh people of the worst hit Shibchar and sadar thanas were marooned.

Meanwhile, more areas of Narsingdi, Kishoreganj and Brahmanbaria districts and some low-lying areas around Dhaka and Narayanganj were also engulfed by flood water.

According to the Flood Information Centre bulletin the Ganges recorded further rise at Pankha and Rajshahi while it receded slightly at Hardinge Bridge, Goalando and Bhagyakul. The river was still flowing above its danger level by 62 cm at Goalundo and 81 cm at Bhagyakul.

The Lakhya at Narayangani recorded rise by 6 cm and was flowing 18 cm above danger mark. The Kaliganga at Taraghat recorded further rise by 12 cm and was flowing 45 cm above its danger mark.

The Turag in the same basin recorded further rise by 5 cm at Mirpur and 9 cm at Tongi and it was now flowing 4 cm above its danger mark at

In Sirajganj. 70 more villages were inundated in the last 24 hours till 6 pm yesterday. With this, the number of flood-affected villages in the district stood at about 900, officials said.


