

## Spaniards leave it late





OFLANDO, Florida, July 25 (AP): When it came down to the crunch, those old soccer powers still had that little bit extra to make the difference.

Spain scraped through with a goal in injury time Wednesday night to deny Australia a place in the quarterfinals of the Olympic tournament. And the United States still cannot play with the big boys after falling a goal short to win their Group A. Instead, the home nation was a eliminated.

In Orlando, Real Madrid star Raul Gonzalez scored two vital goals, the last one three minutes in injury time, as the defending Olympic champions rallied from a two-goal deficit to beat Australia 3-2 in a Group

B decider. The decisive goal, a header off a pass from Ivan de la Pena. came just seven minutes after Santiago Denia kicked in a rebound to complete a stirring. late comeback from a 2-0

deficit. The victory sends Spain into a quarterfinal match against Argentina on Saturday. Australia had shocked Spain by scoring twice in the first 10 minutes through Aurelio Vid-

mar and Steve Corica. Spain pulled one back in the 41st minute with an exquisite free kick taken by Gonzalez but spent much of the second half fruitlessly trying to break down Australia's offside trap.

The Australian defence lived a charmed life, with Spain's Fernando Morientes

having two goals disallowed. But they appeared set to survive on the back of Spain's

### Men's h'ball Sweden beat USA

ATLANTA, July 25: Magnus Wislander made five goals in six shots as Sweden pulled away for a 23-19 victory over the United States in the opening Olympic men's team handball game for both teams Wednesday night, reports AP.

Darrick Health led the US team with four goals, but he needed 15 shots to score that many. Sweden is one of the medal favourites for the men while the United States has never fared well in the sport.

In other men's games Wednesday, Croatia edged Switzerland 23-22. Russia routed Kuwait 32-20. France tripped Spain 27-25. Egypt beat Algeria 19-16 and Germany crushed Cuba 30-20.

Mohamed Mkacher headed in a corner kick with 15 minutes left for Tunisia's equaliser but it was not enough to keep the north African nation in the competition.



### 'Dream Team' in qtrs

ATLANTA, July 25: "Dream Team III" suffered its closest call in Olympic history here Wednesday, beating an injuryweakened Lithuanian squad 104-82 to clinch a berth in the Olympic quarter finals, reports

But the only dreams being fulfilled by "Dream Team III" so far at the Centennial Games are those of rivals hoping to stay in contention for a half against the world's greatest players.

"Dream Team III" reached 100 points for the first time at the Games, but were kept to a 22-point margin, breaking the mark set in their 96-68 opening triumph over Argentina.

The US are expected to secure a top seed for playoff rounds by beating China on

Friday and Croatia on Sunday. The US squad opened a 32-23 lead in the opening 12:09. but Darius Lukminas and Gintaras Einikis each scored six points to even the game at 40-40 just 3:07 before half-time.

"Dream Team III" closed the half with a 50-42 edge at the break, closing another lacklustre chapter in a history of slow starts.

### Germany earns first gold

ATLANTA, July 25: Christian Klees of Germany set a world record score of 704.8 points today to win the gold medal in the men's 50-metre free rifle prone shooting event

at the Olympics, reports AP.
It was Germany's first gold medal of the Atlanta Games. following a flurry of silver and

Klees, 28, did not score lower than a 10.3 in his 10 shots in the finals. His total, including a world-record tying perfect score of 600 in the preliminary round, broke the previous mark of 703.5 by Jens Harskov of Denmark in 1991.

Sergei Beliaev of Kazakhstan won the silver with 703.3. The bronze went to Jozef Gonci of Slovakia with 701.9.

### ... the champ in the Tales of unexpected



ATLANTA, July 25: Ireland's Francis Barrett seized the limelight from the Cubans and United States in the Olympic boxing ring on Wednesday with the highest score yet, reports Reuter.

France's Nordine Mouichi and Canada's Troy Ross also punched their way ahead by securing the first knockouts a rarity in amateur boxing -

seen so far. Barrett, who lives with his family on a caravan site outside Galway in western Ireland, beat Brazilian light-welter-

weight Zely Ferreira 32-7. The stocky Irishman, given a rousing welcome into the arena, meant business from the start. Barrett simply walked straight at the Brazilian and set about battering him into submission. He inflicted a standing eight count in a first round that he took 11-0.

He took even more points in the second, allowing the Brazilian a few as well to go into the third 23-4 up.

Barrett claimed later that he had not got a clue who was winning the fight. He was probably alone there. "The thing with computer

scores is that you don't know whether you are ahead or behind," he said. "So I thought I'd just keep

going. Light-welterweight Mouichi decided to take the shorter road and felled Pakistan's Ullah Usman with a cracking left hook after one minute 24

seconds of the first round. The blow sent Usman crashing heavily to the floor and ringside doctor rushing in to remove the Pakistani's headgear and check that he was in no medical danger.

Light-heavyweight Ross was the first to win by knockout. overcoming Roland Reforme of the Seychelles with 44 seconds to go in the third round with a powerful left cross The Cubans and the

Americans, used to dominating the conversation, took something of a back seat.

Disappointed fans booed world light-heavyweight champion Antonio Tarver out of the ring on his Olympic debut after a poor 5-2 points win over Russian Dmitri Vybornov.

"I felt a little desperate in the third round. I assure you it will be better next time. Tarver said.

US coach Al Mitchell made no attempt to soften the blow. "I thought his performance

was lousy," he said Cuban light welterweight Hector Vinent earlier got the programme underway with an impressively swift win over

Korean Han Hyung-Min that won far greater applause. The Olympic champion took the first round 4-3 and forced a standing eight count on the Korean after just 28 seconds of the second round.

He then stopped him for good with a right-left combination for a 57th second knockdown. Vinent's win meant that 11 of the 12 Cubans competing in the boxing tournament were through to the second round,

with light-heavyweight Freddy Rojas in action later. Eleven of the 12 Americans were also through, with lightwelterweight David Diaz beating Virgin Islander Jacobo Garcia 27-2 to become the

highest US scorer.
