# Life and Teachings of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH)

VERY year the Muslims. almost the world over celebrate 12th Rabiul Awwai (Muslim calendar month) as anniversary of birth of holy prophet Muhammad (PBUH) with due religious solemnity. In Bangladesh also the day is declared as public holiday and special arrange-ments for holding discussion on the life and teachings of the holy prophet are made.

Prophets (PBUT) were sent from time to time to guide the mankind to lead a life as ordained by the Almighty . 

HE Holy Quran calls not only the followers of Islam to unity and brotherhood but also the followers of other great religions, such as Christianity and Judaism. The Holy Quran says: "Prophet Muhammad (SAW) believes in what has been revealed to him from his Lord, and so do the believers: they all believe in Allah and His apostles. According to the Quran, Islam is the religion of all the believers in God. In other words, in the perspective and terminology of the Holy Quran Christianity and Judaism too are, in a sense, part of the same continuous revelation That is why, in the Quran. even Ibrahim is said to be a "true" Muslim

Furthermore, in the Quran we read: "Say: We believe in Allah and what has been revealed to us, and what has been revealed to Ibrahim and Ismail and Ishaq and Yaqub and the tribes, and what was given to Musa and Isa and to gle hand." During his lifetime the believers and Muslims

the other prophets from their Lord: we do not make any distinction between any of them, and to Him we do submit." With this background of believing in the genuineness and truthfulness of all the prophets of God, it is well justified that the Quran calls the believers true brothers of each other

Finally, the Holy Quran recommends its followers to be always united and not to fight each other, because then they will become weak and their power will be destroyed. So. in the Quran there is a strong recommendation and, in fact, an instruction for the unity of the Muslim world which, in the Quranic terminology, also includes people of the Book. i.e., all believers in God, in the Last Day, and in the revelations of the holy prophets.

The Holy Prophet of Islam (SAW) is quoted as saying: The believers are like a a sin-

He vigorously tried to unite all the believers under the banner of Islam, the Quran and his Prophecy. Also on numerous occasions, when there was an eminent danger of a conflict between the so-called Muhajir and Ansar, the Prophet (SAW) personally intervened in order to cease the hostilities. The same tradition was

preserved by the Holy Imams. For example, Imam Khomeni mostly addressed the problems of the whole Muslim community stressed on Islamic unity. "You Muslims of the world and you followers of the school monotheism, the secret of all the problems of the Muslim countries is the difference of opinions and lack of unity. Islam, as a universal religion, does not recognize any boundaries based on face or geographical location. In the Quran, as well as in the tradition of the Holy Prophet (SAW), the message has always been addressed to the people.

Shrimp-farming: A Tale of

N every November 7, since 1990, hundreds of people pour into this remote coastal village of Harinkhola in Khulna stand in

It needs saline water to grow shrimp. The saline water destroys the fertility of the croplands. To bring in the saline water into these farms, locally known as ghers, the shrimp cultivators can be as cruel as the sponsors of Nilchash (cultivation of indigo) who existed during the British rule. Karunamoyee is one of

a demonstration of local farmers to protest the invasion of saline water into the fertile croplands due to shrimp-farming. She was gunned down by the hoodlums who were illegally cutting an embankment to let the sea water pass into

In her death Karunamovee has inspired thousands of villagers to standup against the injustice. From an ordinary poor village woman her name has now shot into international prominence. Many who see the unplanned shrimp cultivation also as a threat to the environment have joined the local people. The solidarity comes

tors from grabbing the croplands and evicting the poor farmers. If offer to buy the croplands is turned down, reportedly, the shrimp cultivators resort to coercion.

Canals are being dug and embankments cut to channel sea water into the fields, as shrimp culture requires a steady supply of saline water. Thus salt is eating up, for good, soil nutrients of the land, making croplands permanently sterile.

Farmers in many areas complained that salt water from ghers seep into adjacent farmlands and sterilise those. So, when a gher owner wishes to take lease of the adjacent land, the farmer is left with no alternative but giving it away under pressure. And then there are other coercive ways like threats and intimidation. and also, allegedly, abduction and even rape. Thus, shrimp farmers are grabbing acres after acres. People are forced to leave their ancestral homes and professions.

Take Deluti union, for example, which is a Hindu majority area where many of the Hindus migrated to India over the past 10 years to escape intimidation of gher

Admitted UP chairman of Kapilmuni, Rashiduzzaman: Many Hindu families have left. Many poor Muslims also migrated to near-by towns." Said Sudhir Kumar Mandal

of Khaliar Char: "I heard of those sad stories about indigo farming during British colonialists, how badly people used to be tortured by indigo traders. Torture by shrimp traders now, reminds me of those stories. These people can go to any extent.

Not only the villagers are losing their farmland, shrimpfarming has endangered the very ecology of the region. Salinity has seriously threatened cattle population by causing acute fodder scarcity. Trees are drying up and sweetwater fish depleting.

Hundreds of thousands of villagers in the coastal shrimpfarming area are witnessing helplessly their green croplands fast turning into grey wastelands.

"It is a short-term gain by the few at the expense of longterm losses of many," said an NGO worker Domestic animals like cows

and buffaloes which the farmers largely depend on for cultivation, milk and meat are on the verge of extinction due to dearth of fresh water and green grass. According to a recent study, there were about 1.05.566 cattlehead in Dakope, a shrimp-farming thana, in 1987 which dwindled to 50,000 in 1990. The number, again, came down to 22.187 the next year

Gausul Alam, a veterinary doctor in nearby Batiaghata thana, said salinity in soil was severely affecting livestock population. "Death rate among livestock has reached to an

alarming proportion. Villagers in the area are no longer interested in cattle-farming".

Ahmed said. Besides causing havoc on cattleheads, rising salinity is assumed to have been causing diseases like diarrhoea, dysentery, typhoid and jaundice. According to local health officials, the number of patients

infected by such diseases are

increasing day by day. The shrimp exporters and maybe the government are reaping profit, but the poor villagers are not. They are only paying the price. A study shows that a farmer, who owns a land of five bigha, can earn not more than Tk 12,500 by leasing out his land to gher owners. But he can easily earn Tk 35,000 from the land by cultivating rice and other supporting crops. On the contrary, net earning of a gher owner from same volume of land

stands around Tk 2 lakh. What is really alarming is that shrimp-farming is probably causing permanent damage to the land. A farmer, even if he gets back his land, won't be able to grow crop in it.

Local people had once fought to save their land from salinity. As a result, Water Development Board (WDB) had constructed about 1000 hydraulic structures and 4,800 kilometres of embankment along the coastal belt of Khulna, Satkhira and Bagerhat But the gher owners frequently slit those structures and bring in saline water.

Amal Halder of Pankhali vil lage recalled how happy they were when a polder was constructed outside his village. "The polder was a great blessing for us. We started growing more crops. Those were the golden days now blackened by the shrimp business.

Shrimp-farming has also fired tension in the rural society. Armed gangs hired by gher owners now frequent the villages. Peace is fast-disappear-

There is no denying that shrimp farming has become a boon to the country's economy. Shrimp export letches more than Tk 12,000 crore a year. But the dividend is not reaching the people who are losing their cropland, homestead and traditional livelihood Few will want an end to

shrimp business. But authorities must ensure that it becomes friendly to the local people and ecology

"It will be unfair to blame the shrimp growers for harming the ecology," said Dr Aftabuzzaman, President of National Shrimp Cutlerists Association. "The ecology was already being threatened by the unplanned construction of polders in the area. Considering the plight of

the local people Dr Aftabuzzaman said his association has already proposed that 10 per cent of the earnings should be spent for the development of the area and the people's welfare in a special programme.


