Social justice alongside economic growth in formulating budget stressed

Experts and political leaders in a post-budget panel discussion yesterday laid emphasis on effectively considering the issue of social justice alongside with economic growth while formulating budgets, to achieve the goal of poverty alleviation, reports BSS.

They called for overhauling the whole budgetary process to ensure transparency, efficiency, equity and people's participation. The discussion also observed that the budgetary process should be triangular, encompassing the government, people and the think tank.

The discussion, titled National Budget: From the perspective of poverty alleviation, was organised by the Institute for Development Policy Analysis and Advocacy (IDPAA) of Proshika, a leading NGO.

The inaugural function was attended by Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina as the chief guest.

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman, noted economists, former finance and planning ministers of past governments, MPs and representatives of various low income groups of society took part in the discussion.

The key-note paper was prepared by senior research fellow of BIDS, Dr Atiur Rahman, Matir Rahman of Dhaka University and Mirza Mohammad Shafiqur Rahman research fellow of Samannaya, an NGO analysing the past three national budgets on the basis of the opinions of rural and urban poor.

Presenting the paper, Dr Rahman said 71 per cent of their target people, in the country's northern region, think themselves as poor.

while the condition of 20 per cent showed that they were really hard core poor as their per head daily income is only Tk 10.

He said poverty is being transferred to the urban areas from the rural areas while 71 per cent of the urban slum-dwellers are poor and 20 per cent are hard-core poor as their per head daily income is Tk 16 only.

Dr Rahman said their study found that 55 per cent of the urban people and 90 per cent of rural people do not know what the budget is, despite being aware of their problems.

The main speaker said although about one fourth of the total budget allocation is being spent for health and education, the poorest section in both urban and rural areas remain beyond the reach of the facilities of sanitation, pure drinking water and above all, the healthy services.

Taking part in the discussion, which was moderated by Dr Binayak Sen of BIDS, Prof Rehman Sobhan said most of the country's development projects from the donors and the government has little control over them.

Prof Sobhan said this phenomenon is making the country aid dependent as the target of the programmes could not be achieved because they are not formulated in accordance with the practical situation.

He stressed the need for mobilisation of local resources for sustainable development and achieving a bargaining position with the government. Prof Sobhan also observed that a little portion of the aid reached the target people due to aid system losses. He advocated developing a strong local

government system and joint efforts of government and NGOs for generation of internal resources to get rid of donors' control.

Economist Prof Anisur Rahman called for changing the attitude towards the poor, considering their contribution to the national economy. He said the economists have drawn a poverty line treating the poor as 'domestic animals.'

He said the poor can be entrepreneurs, even in the export oriented industries, instead of merely selling their labour.

Former finance minister M Saifuzzaman said despite the little time the new government got to prepare the budget, it has a unique feature as it has given emphasis on agriculture.

He appreciated that Tk 100 crore has been allocated for subsidy in agriculture, but cautioned that only loan or subsidy cannot ensure agricultural development, unless the rural infrastructure, including communication, education and power supply systems are developed.

Former planning minister, Dr Moeen Khan laid emphasis on peoples' participation in development planning. The country needs a perspective planning with people participation, he said, adding, 'otherwise we cannot go far in our efforts and desire for poverty eradication.'

Sajeda Chowdhury MP, Panna Kaisar MP, former deputy governor of Bangladesh Bank Syed Ali Kabir, editor of The Daily Star Mahiuz Anwar and Prof of Dhaka University Dr Borhanuddin Khan Jahangir also spoke on the occasion.

Digital telephone in N'ganj

6000 connections by March '97

Post and Telecommunications Minister Mohammad Nasim inaugurated the newly constructed Narayanganj Telephone Exchange Bhavan yesterday, reports UNB.

The Minister talked to Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina over telephone from Narayanganj Telephone Bhavan and expressed the gratitude on behalf of the people of Narayanganj.

Addressing a function on the occasion, the Minister assured that 6,000 digital telephone connections would be given by March 1997 through the exchange.

He said with the inauguration of the exchange, built at a cost of Tk 2 crore, the long awaited demand of the local people has been materialised, said a PID handout.

Emphasising the need for building up Narayanganj as a city of business hub, Nasim said all the modern telecommunications facilities would be expanded to Narayanganj within a shortest possible time and the private sector would be encouraged in this regard.

The monopoly in the business of cellular telephone will be brought under competition soon," he said.

MPs M Akram, AKM Shamim Osman, Major General (ret'd) KM Shaif Ullah, Prof Rezaul Karim and Shegupta Yasmin were present on the occasion. T&T Chairman MH Chowdhury also addressed the function.

Later, the Minister inaugu-

rated the new telephone revenue office where the people of Narayanganj will pay their telephone bills instead of Dhaka.

Meanwhile, the Telecommunications Minister also instructed the local authorities of the T and T to install a card phone at the Narayanganj Press Club by today. The instruction was made following a demand by the Press Club authorities raised on the occasion.

APSU calls for 2-day strike at JU from today

She left behind her husband Abdul Hamid Khan, son Roksaid Fauzi Khan and daughter Lina Ferdous Khan.

Rotarian Badruddin Ahmed, a retired Additional Secretary, died in Philadelphia, USA on Monday, reports BSS.

His body is expected to arrive in the city shortly, an official handout said yesterday.
