Light at some wavelengths slightly longer than visible (near-infrared, or, specifically, 0.94 and 1.08 microns) is able to penetrate through both the haze and the methane in Titan's atmosphere. The images aren't crystal clear, due to both the size of Titan (only ~20 HST pixels across) and the presence of the haze, but they do show the presence of some features on Titan's sur-

These features have now been seen several times, so we are sure we are looking at a real surface feature. As the press release mentioned, the probe will parachute in over a boundary between light and dark regions.


