any taxes on luxury items which are being bought with the hard-earned foreign currency. Besides, he said, there was nothing in the budget to create jobs for the unem-

When asked about their opinions on the budget, people from various walks of life said the budget hardly made any change in their day-to-day life. "Most of us are concerned with what prices would go up or down" said a housewife at Dhanmondi adding the new budget did not give us any guideline in this regard.

About the decision to bring luxury items, including motor cars and air-conditioners, under the purview of the Value Added Tax, a car trader in Dhanmondi area said, this will result in a steady rise in the price of cars

"We already pay 10 per cent tax when a reconditioned car is taken to the show room, said Naim Gaffar, a car dealer, expressing his surprise at further expansion of the VAT network.

Some people welcomed the decision to reduce taxes on amusement equipment from 45 per cent to 30 per cent. This will encourage people to invest in the amusement sector, they said.

"I am trying to set up an amusement park in Rajshahi Reduction in taxes will give a boost to my project, said Molla Harun, a businessman in the

About reduction of duty on double decker buses, some said taxes on all sorts of public vehicles should be reduced in order to increase the number of transport in the city roads.

An owner of a grocery in Dhanmondi area welcomed the budget as, according to him, the prices of many essentials would come down shortly. He said, the government had done well by waving taxes on many agriculture products "which would not only help the farmers but also the consumers."

poverty. Hasina said participation of people, particularly the poor, is indispensable for the development and poverty alleviation. Because of this reason we are determined to form decentralised but powerful local governments, the Prime Minister

The Prime Minister thought right allocation of resources on right sectors could be one of the important ways of remov-

ing poverty. She said one lakh six hundred fifty one crore taka were spent on annual development programmes during last two decades, but the country has not achieved the desired result from this expenditure.

Ambitious targets for growth rate were set, but they were never achieved. A very few programmes adopted under ADP were completed as per schedule. As a result the burden of debt on the poor people of this country kept in-

creasing day by day, she added. The Prime Minister said her government was trying to present such a budgets as would play a positive role in alleviating poverty. She pointed out that her government got only three weeks' time to pre-

sent the current budget. Prime Minister Hasina stated that growth rate could not necessarily alleviate poverty. But if poverty is alleviated, the growth rate would certainly increase, she said. Speaking on the occasion LGRD Minister Zillur Rahman

said it would not possible to al-
