

A Spanish-Dutch finale





ATLANTA. Aug 1: Spain and the Netherlands will clash in Friday's final of the Olympic hockey tournament after beat-ing both of the 1992 finalists in their semifinal matches on

Wednesday, report agencies. Neither country has won the Olympic title before. Spain won the silver in Western-boycotted Moscow Games of 1980 and a bronze way back in 1960. It is the Netherlands' first appearance in an Olympic final since 1952 when they lost to India. They only won the bronze at Seoul in 1988.

Giant-killers Spain stormed into the final by crushing Australia's gold medal hopes with a 2-1 victory in the first semifinal on Wednesday.

The ninth seeds, who stunned defending champions Germany and World Cup holders Pakistan on their way to winning Group A scalped one more fancied rival with a determined second-half display.

With both teams locked goalless after an uninspiring first session. Victor Phjol put Spain ahead in the 49th minute following a goal-mouth scrambled from a penalty corner.

Juan Escarre scored the second goal five minutes later from a penalty stroke after inform striker Javier Arnau was stick-checked inside the cir-

cle by Stephen Davies. Paul Gaudoin reduced the

margin seven minutes from the final whistle with a penalty corner push, but Australia failed to get the equaliser against the spirited Spanish

Australia, silver-medalists in Barcelona, have themselves to blame for once again losing out on the gold medal in their fourth semifinal appearance since 1964.

They wasted three penalty corners in the first session and one in the second, and twice their strikers fumbled before an open goal.

The jubilant Spanish players hugged each other after the final whistle and acknowledged the support from some 2,000 flag-waving supporters by do-ing a victory lap.

An emotional Spanish coach Antonio Forrellat said it was his team's greatest moment in

"It's hard to describe my feelings," he said. "This was our biggest match ever and we

"Now we have an even bigger role to perform. It's not that the boys are overawed, but they are very emotional. After all, not even our own supporters expected us to make the

It was a remarkable turnabout for the Spanish men. who finished eighth in last year's European Championships and ninth in the Sydney World Cup.

They even lost a practice

match against Australia 1-3 a few days before the Atlanta

Olympics started. Taco Van Den Honert scored a hattrick as the Netherlands brushed aside defending champions Germany

The 30-year-old playmaker showed his 209-match experience with three breathtaking goals on either side of the interval to light up an otherwise low-key semifinal.

The line-up for the final mocked at seedings commit-tee, who rated the Dutch sec-ond behind Pakistan and

placed Spain ninth — just above debutantes South Africa, Malaysia and the United States.

Dutch coach Roelant Oltmans echoed his Spanish counterpart's feelings that it was a day to remember for both teams.

"Making an Olympic final is obviously very special, a great moment for my team", Oltmans said, before heaping rich praise on his match-winner.

"There's little more one can say about Taco. He's a treasure for Dutch hockey. He's been around for so long that one has almost taken him for granted." Oltmans said he did not believe the Dutch were overwhelming favorites to beat

Spain in the final. "Spain have to be good to have come so far, it will be stupid to take them lightly. We have played them before and understand their game.' "I think we will be wellprepared on Friday."

Olympic badminton Hoyer-Larsen does Denmark proud

ATLANTA. Aug 1: Denmark's Poul-Erik Hoyer-Larsen broke into, an Asian monopoly by winning the men's singles over China's Dong Jiong 15-12, 15-10 Thursday in men's badminton, and South Korea's Bang Soo-Hyun took the women's gold medal, report agencies.

ATLANTA, Aug 1: Carls Lewis' hopes of a record tenth Olympic gold medal were firmly dashed here on Wednesday when US track and field head coach Erv Hunt ruled him out of the relay team, reports AFP. Lewis, after winning the

long-jump to take his gold medal tally to nine on Monday. began putting pressure on the Americans by demanding he should be selected for the 4x100 relay squad. But Hunt said Wednesday he

had every confidence in his team of Jon Drummond, Leroy Burrell, Michael Marsh and Dennis Mitchell, adding that Lewis' manager Joe Douglas had told him that Lewis was ready if needed.

"We have taken this into account but it changes nothing as he did not attend the training camp" said Hunt.

Drummond, who had earlier backed Burrell's inclusion ahead of Lewis said: "I respect Carl Lewis. He is a living legend and I understand that the public would have liked to see

Azhar, Sidhu to appear before dock

BOMBAY, Aug 1: Indian cricket team captain Mohammad Azharuddin and opening batsman Navjot Singh Sidhu would appear on August 3 before the three-member panel, probing Sidhu's desertion of the team, accusing his skipper of humiliation and victimisation during the tour of England in June last

The panel, appointed by the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), includes former chairman of the selection committee. Raj Singh, former Indian captain Sunil Gavaskar and BCCI joint secretary.

Sidhu would be arriving here on August 2 while Azharuddin is expected tomorrow, according to the BCCI of-

Lewis did not endear himself to other team members when he announced on Tuesday: "I think we should put our four best runners in, and I've beaten everybody in the team this year, even if I had problem at the trials. "If I could get the chance to

win 10 golds that would be great. The pressure in on because people want me to run and feel that I have a right to

A poll on sports network ESPN found 65 per cent of American fans wanted Lewis to be put in the team. Had Lewis been allowed to

run, he would have been virtually guaranteed a tenth gold medal to beat Finnish long-distance runner Paavo Nurmi's record of nine Olympic titles won in the 1920s.

The US have such strength in depth that they are virtually unbeatable in the discipline. despite their failure to put a man on the 100m podium

Only a bungled changeover - as happened to the US quartet in Seoul in 1988 and again in the World Championships last year, seems to stand in their way

The US have never been beaten in a completed relay in the Olympic or World Champi-

They can claim 14 out of the 18 Olympic men's 4x100m relay held but all their defeats - at Stockholm in 1912, Rome in 1960 and in Seoul - have followed disqualifications for illegal changeovers, the US boycotted 1980 Moscow Games.

As Drummond said when asked who offered the major opposition here: "What competition? There is none. We are going to win it. There is no question about it. It's as simple as that. Our biggest opponent

will be ourselves. The US are also unbeaten in five World Championships. apart from the 1995 edition in Gothenburg, Sweden ... where again they bungled the changeover, with Drummond one of the culprits.

Yugoslavs in v'ball semis

ATLANTA, Aug 1: Yugoslavia claimed its biggest volleyball victory ever when it won a fifth-set tiebreaker to upset defending gold medalist Brazil in the men's volleyball quarterfinals Wednesday, reports AP.

Yugoslavia, whose players have no previous Olympic experience, advanced into the medal round with its 15-6, 15-5, 8-15, 14-16, 15-10 victory. The Yugoslavs have played their last three matches without captain Dejan Brdovic, who returned home last week after the death of 14-month-old son.

"If we go back without a medal it would be a defeat," said Vladimir Batez, who led Yugoslavia with 35 kills. "We believe we are capable of winning a medal. What the color is doesn't matter.


'Court cup' goes to Imran

LONDON, Aug 1: Former England cricket legends lan Botham and Allan Lamb lost the High Court libel case brought against former Pak istani captain Imran Khan on Wednesday and now face costs estimated at up to 500,000 pounds (750000 dollars), reports AFP.

Imran had insisted from the start he had not accused either man of being racist, but had criticised the section of the tabloid press which referred to pakicheats"

He also denied calling anyone - and specifically Botham - a cheat in The Sun article, which said that the "biggest names of English cricket" ad interfered with the ball in a way which today would be considered illegal

He claimed his attempts at reconciliation with the Englishmen including the offer of an open letter to The Times in July, 1994, were rebuffed because the "knives were out" for the Pakistani team, led by Imran, after England's 1992 World Cup defeat by his side.

STONE MOUNTAIN, Geor gia, Aug 1: Tenacious Spaniard Arantxa Sanchez Vicario on Wednesday put herself on tar get for a full set of Olympic medals by beating mercurial Czech Jana Novotna to reach the women's tennis final, report agencies

There she will meet Ameri can Lindsay Davenport who scored a bitter 6-2, 7-6 sweet victory over her best friend. the flu-stricken Mary Joe Fernandez.

Sanchez-Vicario who landed a singles bronze and a doubles silver in her hometown of Barcelona in 1992, said after her 6-4, 1-6, 6-3 victory "I am looking for a full set now."

Sanchez Vicario, a real streetfighter with her raw baseline power, won through to the final because she was mentally much tougher on the big points and seized every chance she got.

Novotna, who suffered cramps in her left leg in the

last set, could never produce the dazzling form that helped here knock out number one seed Monica Seles in the quarter-finals.

The match exposed a rift in their doubles partnership. Novotna claimed to be the more popular player. Novotna accused her friend of poor

por smanship. "She's been questioning every single call there is, even when there's no reason for it," Novotna said. "That's really upsetting, because you wouldn't expect that from a player of her calibre. You would expect a little bit more fair

"But it's nothing personal. She doesn't do it only to me. She does it with everybody." Sanchez Vicario denied

questioning calls. "I'm very surprised that she says that," the Spaniard said. "I was just doing my job and concentrating and playing well. May be she was disappointed because every time she has a

chance, she lost against me." In singles, Sanchez Vicario has won seven of 13 matches against Novotna. They've been playing doubles together on the WTA Tour since 1994, but Novotna said they are friends only "in a professional way."

"I know when I step on the court that I'm a more popular player than she is." Novotna said. "Whatever she's doing or whenever she's like that, she has to live with it. And for me the most important thing is that I know who I am and that I am more popular than she is. no matter what."

After meeting with reporters, Novotna and Sanchez Vicario returned to the court for a semifinal match in doubles - this time against each other
