

Stockbrokers, traders opine

Liberal policy measures in proposed budget to help flourish capital markets

Some liberal policy measures suggested by the proposed budget have contributed to flourishing capital markets of the country.

The share markets boomed further last week as a number of positive measures were taken in the budget, opined stockbrokers and traders.

They said that the investors responded positively to the proposal for withdrawal of lock-in system, exemption of capital-gain tax and tax on the sale of bonus shares, and reduction of corporate income tax in the budget for 1996-97.

Although, on Thursday, the closing day of last week, the Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE) experienced a little slide, the overall performance of the share market was remarkable, market players said.

All market indicators of both DSE and CSE witnessed a

major jump on Tuesday and Wednesday, the first two days after the budget presentation at the Jatiya Sangsad. The market was closed on Sunday and Monday on the occasion of budget announcement and Eid-e-Miladun Nabi.

The All Share Price Index at DSE and CSE rose by 36.39 and 17.75 points respectively in only four-day business during the week.

The market capitalisation of the DSE reached Taka 7859.07 crore on Thursday increasing by Taka 249.61 crore from previous week's closing amount of Taka 7609.46 crore.

At the DSE floor, on an average 5 lakh 87 thousand shares and debentures valued at over Taka 12 crore have changed hands during the week.

Out of 113 traded issues daily, 68 gained and 41 in-

creased while 3 remained unchanged.

Local investors have taken the proposals of the budget in a positive way and that has been reflected in the market in the following days, said Prof. Abu Ahmed, President, Bangladesh Share Investors Forum.

But he said that the foreign investors were yet to come as they are observing how the government carried out its economic reform policies.

The foreigners probably judge the transparency of our stock markets and standard of our auditing system before taking decision to invest in large scale, Abu Ahmed said.

However, some DSE members were disappointed as the decisions taken at the policy level were not fully implemented.

Earlier, it was observed that the different tax exemptions

and incentives given by the budget declaration were not implemented due to lack of proper cooperation by the tax officials and clear definition of the sectors, M A Huq Hawlader, former honorary secretary of the DSE said.

He alleged that although income taxes were exempted from some sectors, still there were ambiguities in their definitions.

He said the investors would not be interested much to hold any issue for long time as the capital-gain and trading-gain were not classified in the budget proposal.

Hawlader demanded more simplification of the income tax system, saying that it would help further expansion of the capital markets.

He hoped that the market indicators would go up further in the coming days through ups and downs and some corrections.

Mian Abdur Rashid, a member of the DSE, said that his seven years' tax payments were pending due to clear definition of gross income tax and capital-gain tax.

Although finance minister in the previous budgets had declared tax exemptions from several sectors, the income-tax officials refused to accept those, he alleged.

Cigarette makers hail budget

Anwar Yusuf, Chairman, Bangladesh Cigarette Manufacturers Association, has hailed the budget for the fiscal 1996-97, says a press release of the association.

This is a balanced budget by which private sector will be encouraged and it will play vital role in alleviating poverty of the nation, he opined.

BJA team calls on Hasina

A 17-member delegation of Bangladesh Jute Association (BJA) yesterday called on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her office here, reports BSS.

The delegation led by BJA's Chairman Abdur Razzaque Akonda placed before the Prime Minister several suggestions to resolve problems they were facing in raw jute trade and export.

The Prime Minister heard their problems patiently and saw their suggestions and assured them that those would be looked into with due consideration.

She said that her government's main aim was to protect the interest of the farmers and added, "with that aim in view, we will give our attention on all sides."

Secretary to the Prime Minister Dr. Mahiuddin Alamgir was also present.

Rail privatisation prompts renewed criticism in UK

LONDON, Aug 3: Rail privatisation has prompted renewed criticism of executive rewards hereafter revelations that executives of former state-owned companies are to make million of pounds in capital gains, reports AFP.

Sandy Anderson, Managing Director of train leasing company, Porterbrook, beamed from the front page of British newspapers on Friday.

He is set to gain 33.6 million pounds (52 million dollars) from the sale of his company, just seven months after it was sold by the government.

Anderson was a member of a management buy-out team and owns 8.4 per cent of Porterbrook.

US move to punish foreign cos investing in Iran, Libya Clinton risks increasing tension with EU

WASHINGTON, Aug 3: President Bill Clinton risks increasing tensions with the European Union as he prepares to sign a bill to tighten sanctions against foreign companies that invest in Iranian or Libyan oil industries, reports AFP.

The White House announced Thursday that Clinton would sign the bill — which targets firms that invest at least 40 million dollars a year in either country — on Monday, in the wake of a series of suspected terrorist attacks against US interests at home and abroad.

The EU has vowed to strike back at the United States if the sanctions bill become law and accuses Washington of seeking to impose its policies concerning Iran and Libya, which it has accused of terrorism.

EU members are among the top importers of Iranian and Libyan crude oil.

It would be the second US move to apply sanctions to third country firms doing business with an enemy of the United States, following the Helms-Burton Act which attempts to put the squeeze on Cuban President Fidel Castro.

The Iran-Libya bill, originally sponsored by the Republicans, was passed unanimously by the House of Representatives on July 23, one week after it was adopted by the Senate.

On Sunday, Clinton urged the international community to slap "strong sanctions" on countries engaging in or supporting terrorism, among Iran, Iraq, Libya and Sudan.

The United States has sought to pressure its allies to join its unilateral embargo against Iran imposed in June 1995 but EU members argue dialogue with the Iranian government is more effective than the US embargo.

France and Germany say a "critical dialogue" is necessary with Tehran to try to bring the regime in line with international standards of conduct.

Under the measure to be signed Monday, Washington can impose any two of a menu of six sanctions on violators including import and export bans, denial of US bank loans and export-import bank credits, and exclusion from US government contracts.

Clinton would also have to

punish companies that violate the United Nations embargo on Libya, imposed because of Tripoli's refusal to hand over two suspects in the 1988 bombing of a PanAm airliner over Lockerbie, Scotland, that killed 270 people.

The measure is seen as less severe than the anti-Cuba legislation because it would penalise companies that invest after the bill has been signed into law.

The Helms-Burton Act on Cuba allows sanctions against shareholders and executives of companies that invest in the Caribbean island and opens the door for US citizens to sue foreign firms that have invested property expropriated after the 1959 revolution.

A provision to make the Iran-Libya legislation non-retroactive, which the administration lobbied to include in the draft weeks ago, would allow many European firms currently doing business in Iran and Libya to avoid sanctions.

The legislation, strongly supported by Jewish lobby groups in the United States, initially sought to strike at Iran, which fiercely opposes the Middle East peace process.

Myanmar's econ reforms inadequate: ADB

BANGKOK, Aug 3: Myanmar's economic development and foreign exchange policies are not sufficiently up to scratch to merit assistance from the Asian Development Bank (ADB), a senior bank official said yesterday, reports AFP.

Noritada Morita, Director of the ADB's Programmes Department (West) told reporters, here that Myanmar was lagging behind the pace of economic reform across Southeast Asia.

He said while there had been tremendous progress in economic reforms in the region, economic and development policy in Myanmar was "at present, not necessarily up to our standards."

Speaking at a media conference announcing two new regional environmental projects for the greater Makong River basin to be organised under the auspices of the ADB, Morita pinpointed Myanmar's foreign exchange policy as a shortcoming of the ruling military's government's macro-economic management.

He said that the official rate of the local currency, the kyat, set at about six kyats to the US dollar, made it difficult to assess the viability of projects and evaluate which are "bankable."

The going market rate of the kyat is more than 150 kyats to the dollar.
